前言

英语高考中的完型填空题是一种考查学生多项语言能力的综合题型，也是学生普遍觉得不好把握的题型。近几年的高考试题反映出，这一题型不是在篇章中考语法，而是考查学生对语篇内容连贯性的理解和对语言使用准确性的把握，要求学生在基本读懂文章的前提下，进行正确的推理、分析、判断，从而得出正确的答案。在日常教学中，我们常常发现学生在对这一题型进行操练时，往往不知道如何循序渐进地提高解题能力，只是盲目做题，其结果是题目做了不少，但收效甚微。针对这一问题，作者以全新的解题理念入手，将完型填空这一题型分解为微型完型填空、无选项完型填空和模拟完型填空三个部分。使用本书的学生通过对这三个部分的分段练习，将会逐步提高对这一题型的认识，培养良好的解题思维能力，最终圆满地完成这一题型。

一、微型完型填空

本部分将原来的完型填空篇章细分成长句，共200题，以单项填空的形式出现。作者尽量选用地道的英语句子，安排相同词性的选项，不考学生的语法知识，重视对句子意思的正确理解和对一些常用单词或词组的准确把握，培养学生对长句的翻译能力和合理的推理能力。因此，在使用时必须正确理解每个句子，了解英美人的思维方式和表达方式与中国人的不同之处，增强对词汇使用范围的了解，克服中文思维。同时，在确定选项后，应力求弄清楚为什么其他选项是错误的：有时是因为上下句的限制而不能选，有时是因为不合逻辑而不能选……诸多原因确定了选项的唯一性，这正是完型填空的难点所在。另外，该部分选用了许多地道精彩的英语表达法，可视为写作的好素材，如能在使用中认真体会，对一些句子加以背诵、记忆，对英语写作也会有很大的帮助，可谓一石二鸟，事半功倍。

二、无选项完型填空

本部分设计了50篇没有选项的完型填空题，旨在帮助学生提高根据上下文、运用逻辑推理得出正确选项的能力。这是高考中学生作答完型填空题的基本能力之一。该部分的难度大于第一部分，但作者认为这一部分的训练必不可少。在操练这一部分时，学生可能会发现连续多处都无法下手，但只要对整篇的意思有了大概的了解，就不难找出应填之词；有时会发现已经理解了句子的中文意思，但找不到能正确表达这一意思的英语单词，别急，这时离成功已经不远了；如果发现所填的词和参考答案相去甚远，那么一定是对文章中的句子意思理解有误，就要及时调整；如果与参考答案近似，就应认真考虑一下词与词之间的微小差别，或者请教老师，少走一些弯路。作者建议，在练习这一部分时，不可一口气连做多篇，而是要每做完一篇都认真反思一下得与失，总结失误的原因，体会成功的喜悦。

三、模拟完型填空

本部分提供了80篇高考模拟练习。作者力求文章内容新颖，长度、难度适中；选项只注重篇章的意思，不考语法。在练习时应注意通读全文，把握文章的大概意思，正确理解和翻译文章中的重点句子，仔细分析前后句子之间存在的逻辑联系，即句子与句子之间的因果、转折、让步或条件等关系，从而准确地诠释文章原作者的真正意图，使选项完全符合原文所要表达的意思。在做这一部分练习时，不可急于求成，切记提高完型填空解题能力是一个厚积薄发的过程。应心平气和，循序渐进，充分调动自己各方面的知识，提高分析问题和解决问题的能力，从而达到预期的效果。

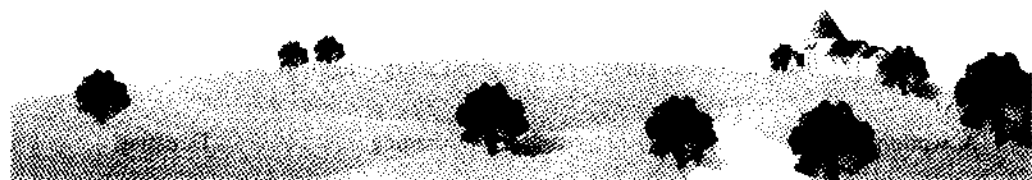
