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前 言

英语词汇是英语语言的基本要素,是语言表达意义的主要载体,也是大学英语六级考试的必考内容。本书根据《大学英语六级考试词汇必备》和词汇学习的特点精心编写而成,对考生在短期内迅速强化词汇知识、突破六级词汇考试关大有裨益。

本书具有以下几个特点:

一、选题严谨

本书作者在深入研究历年大学英语六级考试的词汇部分基础上,严格按照最新修订的考试大纲六级词汇表和实考题的词汇标准和难度,对真题和各种标准化英语考试中所涉及的词汇进行分类和筛选,精编了6个单元的词汇测试题。每个单元由200题组成,并配有答案、详解及译文,语句规范,题型真实,答案准确。

二、点击考点

本书包括了历年和最新的考试真题,力求准确把握六级考试 的最新动向,关注考点。这不仅有助于考生了解新大纲对词汇的 要求,还有助于他们提高应试能力和技巧,考出好成绩。

三、实践性强

本书以测试题的形式,由浅入深,由易到难,循序渐进,帮助考生逐步、快捷地扩大词汇量。单词不能单靠简单的机械记忆,而应该把其放到特定的语言环境中来学习。因此,本书借助语境训练来培养考生的词汇运用能力,使他们不仅能掌握词汇的意义,而且还能熟练掌握其用法,具有实践性和可操作性。
