FOREWORD

MY father has always said to me: "Be the first to walk on the moon because no one ever remembers the second". As usual, my father is right. This is the first time anyone, in China or the West, has produced an original series like ONE WORLD, and it is in many ways an historic adventure. The challenge has been irresistible.

The last two years spent in preparing this year long series have been the most consuming and incredible of all my life. I can honestly say that every moment of my days and nights has been spent in deliberation: What subjects shall we tackle, how can we best accomplish our goals, where can I save money, where can I get money, what's the most dramatic presentation? When I signed the contract with CCTV in December of 1984, I suspected I'd have no personal life for at least two years. What I couldn't know was that my work life would take on such complicated and magnificent coloration.

There have been sacrifices and many ask if the risk, pain and suffering I endured to see this series born was worth it. The answer must be a resounding YES! I knew if we were successful, I'd have done something extraordinary for my homeland. More than any personal deprivation, the chance to make a contribution to China's drive for modernization was what counted. It's rare that one producer's vision can make a global difference. Our show, I am now convinced, makes that difference

Many of you have written to ask for the complete ONE WORLD scripts in English and Chinese. Many journalists have requested behind-the-scene stories of our filming. With CHINESE LITERATURE PRESS, I have decided to record our responses in book form. My wish is that you'll find it informative, entertaining and an insight into the joys and frustrations of television journalism.

NOW, let me share a few thoughts about ONE WORLD:

Our Content

Since our series was unique, we had no mentors for advice. Solutions had to be groped for. Every decision was an experiment. We were treading untested ground in every area. CCTV gives us total freedom in subject choice — that's the good news. The bad news is that along with our gratitude problems about working with no guidelines. Understand this: You are a unique audience — superb, responsive but untested by Western media. It would be so easy to make mistakes. I must try to judge your needs and interests, your experiences, your dislikes in order to come up with programs that will delight. At the same time, I can't just give you my notions of the way the world, our world, ONE WORLD should be: I have to give a journalist's balanced and objective viewpoint and allow you to make up your own minds. I feel that I know China well, yet I remember that I'm still a foreigner. Behind every program was the often unspoken fear that — "Maybe this one is a mistake". I couldn't afford to make mistakes that would cause the cancellation of our series.

Every day someone says to me: "What a splendid life of travel you lead. I envy it".

Don't. The traveling part is not so splendid, after all,

except perhaps in the memories. Traveling to film stories is not like taking a vacation. Jet lag, delays, sleeping in airports are not calculated to make one grin with pleasure. Just think: we visited 15 countries in one and half years and each day had to deal with the logistics of moving eight people from country to country, dealing with plane reservations, visa permits, drafty hotel rooms, unfamiliar food, overweight luggage, cranky customs inspectors, non-working telephones — you name it, we experienced it. The mechanics of the filming is a nightmare even for the best of production coordinators! On top of all this, we had the mammoth task of conceptualizing, researching, planning, filming, writing and finally editing our scripts. And then, there was time — and there was never enough of that; we had to produce two versions (one Mandarin and one English) weekly, a Herculean feat. And then, there was the hardest the budget: Try doing all this with the most limited of funds.

OUR BUDGET

Sponsors are the name of the game. Since CCTV doesn't fund our work, we must raise all monies ourselves. First, at great personal cost, I hired three people to sell advertising: result — not a penny's worth of advertising. The only way to do it was to do it myself. I traveled thousands of miles in the United States, England, Hong Kong and Japan to call on numerous potential sponsors.

Soon after the signing of our contract, Maxwell House Coffee came aboard. Irwin Shane, then Director of International General Foods, saw the significance of our series in China and timed our launch with his popular Maxwell House Coffee. Proctor and Gamble, a mammoth American company that produces 6 out of 10 of the most popular consumer products in America, was next. Vice Chairman and
