Preface 前 言

"读万卷书,行万里路","读书破万卷,下笔如有神",这都是在强调博览群书的重要性。汉语是这样,英语更是如此。初学英语的人要获得英语语感实为不易,但却十分重要。语感从何而来?可以从大量阅读英文材料的学习过程中来。阅读英语文学名著则是一条极好的途径。学生像一块干涸的海绵,被浸泡在语言和文化的海洋中时,他们能全方位地迅速吸收大量养分。但是,如果偶尔读一读英文,却只能像蜻蜓点水,或者像游走河边被溅起的水花浇湿衣衫,那样很难把英语学好。同时,学语言亦是学文化。学习英语文化需要细细摄取,需要长时间熏陶,而阅读英语文化需要细细摄取,需要长时间熏陶,而阅读英语文学名著却能更为有效地帮助学生学习英语文化。

为了能让广大学习英语的学生朋友们在英语语言知识与文化的海洋里遨游,快速获得语感,掌握英语精髓,了解英语国家的社会历史文化背景,我们组织改编了适合于初、中级英语学习者阅读的部分英语文学名著。所编译的作品都是英语国家家喻户晓的名家杰作。它们是:《格列夫游记》、《哈克贝里·费恩历险记》、《粤滨逊漂流记》、《汤姆·索亚历险记》、《雾都孤儿》、《呼啸山庄》、《傲慢与偏见》、《蝴蝶梦》、《嘉莉妹妹》、《简·爱》、《双城记》和《苔丝》。

阅读这些作品,你能了解到英国作家狄更斯笔下的奥立弗的悲惨童年;能读到格列夫游历小人国、大人国的故事;读到 19 世纪发生在呼啸山庄和画眉山庄的爱恨情仇的故事;了解到本内特的几个成年待嫁女儿是如何从傲慢与偏见的迷失中走出来的;能读到十九世纪三、四十年代在美国密西西比河中下游地区马克·吐温笔下以汤姆·索亚和哈克贝里·费恩为首的一群孩子天真浪漫的历险故事……

内容简介

马克·吐温(Mark Twain,1835 - 1910)是美国著名的小说家,一生著述颇丰。他擅长使用幽默和讽刺,针砭时弊时一针见血,毫不留情,其创作将现实主义的刻画和浪漫主义的抒情和谐地统一。他的作品对后来的美国文学产生了深远的影响,人们普遍认为马克·吐温是美国文学史上的一大里程碑。

《汤姆·索亚历险记》是马克·吐温的四大名著之一。 小说描写的是以汤姆·索亚为首的一群孩子天真浪漫的生活。他们为了摆脱枯燥无味的功课、虚伪的教义和呆板的生活环境,做出了种种冒险经历。 汤姆是个聪明好动的孩子,在他身上集中体现了智慧、计谋、正义、勇敢乃至领导等诸多才能。他足智多谋,富于同情心,对现实环境持反感态度,一心要冲出桎梏,去当绿林好汉,去过行使仗义的生活。小说塑造的汤姆·索亚是个有理想、有抱负,同时也有烦恼的形象。他有血有肉,栩栩如生,给读者留下了深刻的印象。在姨妈眼里,他是个顽童,调皮捣蛋,虽然她一次又一次地被他欺骗,但是,波莉姨妈仍然非常爱他。
