前言

Foreword

当前大学生在学习英语方面遇到的最大困惑是,如何将书本上学到的语言知识运用到具体的学习和生活场景中去。如果将自己在校园里的一天活动用英语细致地描述一番,很多同学都会感觉十分困难,更不用说用英语和同学谈论自己的看法和感受了。

《校园英语口语》恰恰可以满足学生提高口语能力的需求,弥补口语不足的缺憾。它帮助学生平时经常接触、非常熟悉、想说而不知道如何用英语表达的事物,学会用地道的英语进行交流,在自己熟悉的环境中轻松自如地使用英语。从入学第一天的报到开始,到其间学习和生活上遇到的困难,以及暑期实习归来等,本书慢慢引导并教会读者如何使用地道的英语就日常生活进行交流。与《校园英语口语》配套的录音带则能帮助读者纠正发音、识别语调,了解口语本身具有的一些特点。

本书是作者基于多年的英语教学经验以及对本科生兴趣、需求的准确把握上完成的。所选题材曾多次征求学生的意见,得到他们的认可,会话内容准确地反映了学生的日常口头交流活动。清华大学美籍教师 Tom Kellie 的口语课在学生中非常受欢迎。Kellie 先生为本书的英文对话倾注了大量的心血,使其语言地道,并极富口语特点。独创的构思、丰富的内容和用地道的英语表达地道的中国学生生

活是本书的三大特色。

本书会话内容以清华大学学生生活为蓝本,书中部分地方体现了清华的特色,但相信大多数内容在大学生中是共同的。有些地方,如校园地理环境描述,其他学校同学只需替换为本校的情况即可。

本书共分20个单元。每个单元围绕同一个主题设立了三个内容相关的英语对话。在每个对话后面列有词汇表。除了文中出现的生词之外,作者还特意增加了一些与本话题相关的扩展词汇,便于学生自己练习时使用。此外,在每个单元后面还设计了两种不同类型的练习。一种是辨认词汇,另一种是完成对话或翻译对话。每个单元的练习之后都附有答案,以方便学生做完练习后及时核对答案。书后的附录是所有对话的中文原文,读者可对照使用。它尤其可以提示读者注意:这样的话是我平时常说的,它用英语怎么说呢?

本教材与当前市面上相同类型的书籍存在两大区别。第一,本书不是通过阅读文字材料引发学生讨论以达到学习口语的目的,而是实实在在地将学生平时遇到的具体场景用英语对话表现出来,学习本书可以使学生掌握纯正地道的英语口语。第二,本书不是通过孤立地排列一些口语句型供学生机械地模仿练习,而是在生动的校园场景里根据学生经常谈论和喜爱的话题编写的。从而避免了其他教材存在的内容空洞、缺乏真实感等缺点,使读者感到言之有物、针对性强。相信这本构思新颖、匠心独运的口语书籍会帮助你在学习英语的道路上快步向前,为日益国际化的中国和2008年将要举办的奥运会贡献自己的力量。

最后,向在编写过程中为本书提出宝贵意见的章学岚、吴锦和Lara S. Bergen表示诚挚的谢意!

L Faint! You know I'm not good looking and I'm really tongue-tied when I try to talk to girls. There's a guy in my dorm room who is so good with girls that he could change "girlfriends" every other week!
