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序言

《高中英语原文分级阅读系列》(第二版)是汤姆森学习出版集团(Thomson Learning)编写的一套系列阅读教材。旨在提高中学生的英语阅读技巧和阅读能力。该套教材共分为五册:

1.	《阅读新旋律》	
2.	《阅读新视野》	
3.	《阅读新论点》	
4.	《阅读新概念》	
5.	《阅读新话题》	高三全册

本套丛书内容丰富。每册书以话题为单元,共分十二章。每单元主题相关,但章节内容独立。该套教材可以满足广大中学生的阅读需要,适用于我国高一年级至高三年级 英语阅读教学。

本套丛书自出版以来,受到广大英语教师和学生的欢迎。为适应现代英语教学不断发展的需要,作者对原书做了改进。与其他阅读教材相比,该套教材有以下突出特点:

- 一、文章内容新颖、取材广泛。该套教材内容涉及教育、医学、环保、法律、历史 以及科技等诸多领域。文章大多选自近几年的报刊、杂志。话题多是人们所关注的热点 和焦点问题,具有新颖性。这样能充分激发学生的学习动机,调动学生的学习兴趣。
- 二、**该套教材渗透着对英语国家文化背景知识的介绍**。有利于培养学生的文化意识, 提高他们的跨文化交际能力。
- 三、阅读任务及活动设计多样、充分。"好的教材应当给学习者提供充足的机会来使用语言,只有这样才能达到交际的目的"(北师大:程晓堂)。作为一套阅读教材,该套从书设计了大量的练习以提高学生的阅读能力和阅读技巧。如:
- 1. Prereading Preparation: 学生通过采访、讨论、填表等活动激活头脑中已有的背景知识,从而有助于学生对文章的理解。
- 2. Reading Comprehension: 为使该套教材适应中国英语教学的要求,在每篇阅读材料后中方编者设计了难度适宜的Reading Comprehension,以便检测学生对文章的理解程度。
- 3. Information Organization:要求学生阅读文章后填表、制图、或写出文章的梗概。 学生通过对文章信息的再加工,加深对文章的理解、促进知识的内化。
- 4. Critical Thinking: 帮助学生更深入地理解文章内容,领会作者意图,并形成自己独立的观点,这样有利于学生批判性思维的形成。
 - 5. Topics for Discussion and Writing: 巧妙地将阅读、口语、书面表达结合在一起。学

生通过子活动,小组讨论等形式来共同学习。这样学生的口语、书面表达能力在阅读训练的同时也得到了充分的训练,使学生的英语综合能力有了进一步的提高。

6. Follow-up Activities: 将文章内容与学生个人经历和生活联系在一起。有些活动要求学生深入生活,进行社会调查,并与同学进行讨论,鼓励学生进行探究性学习。从而激发了学生的学习兴趣,提高了学生的学习积极性。

此外、中方编者编写了单词表、以方便学生的学习和广大教师的教学需要。

A Family Sees America Together

First, Craig and Marlene sold their businesses. Craig had a real estate business, and Marlene owned a small newspaper. Then they sold their large house. Finally, Courtney said goodbye to her classmates, and their dream trip was ready to begin. The Graham family started their trip on July 4, Independence Day. They visited big cities and small towns in all 50 states. They also visited the birthplaces of all the United States' Presidents. They wanted to visit many interesting places, parks, and zoos in the United States, but they also wanted to meet the American people. The Grahams had many wonderful experiences. Many people were very friendly and helpful to them. Some people invited the Graham family to stay in their homes with them. Everyone signed their "guest book".

Every day, Marlene wrote reports about her family's trip. She described the family's daily experiences, where they went, and what they did. Courtney kept a journal of her life on the road. Marlene and Courtney put their writing on the Internet. Schoolchildren from all over the United States followed the Graham family's trip by using computers at home and in school. 
