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总 序

该丛书是为备考大学英语四级的大学生编写的。顺利通过大学英语四级全国统考,对于许多大学生来说已经不能满足了。他们还要过六级,要考研、出国。即使英语基础差一点只满足于通过四级统考的同学,随着大学英语教学和全国统考水平的不断提高,局限于低标准想通过四级也已经越来越困难了。为此,根据大学生学习和备考四级的需要,按照国家教育部最近颁布的大学英语新教学大纲的要求,以新词汇表为依据,我们策划组织了这套《四级备考步步高》丛书。

参加该丛书编写的作者大都是长期从事大学英语教学和研究的专家、教授。他们积自己多年来的教学经验和研究成果,根据自己多年来对大学英语教学和统考的深刻把握,以大学英语教学新大纲为依据,按照四级统考的题型要求和新词汇表的内容,对近年来教学和统考中遇到的重点、难点、疑点问题进行重点讲解,以帮助同学在全面复习的基础上更前进一步,争取四级统考的更好成绩。

该丛书是按照统考题型的分类编写的,以便于同学有针对性 地选择一两个突破口重点攻关,迅速提高自己的英语水平,并在四 级统考中夺高分。本丛书首批推出六种,今后将逐步补充、完善、修 改、提高。值此丛书出版之际,我们衷心地欢迎从事大学英语教学 和研究的诸位专家及广大读者,对本丛书的编写和出版提出宝贵 意见和建议,以便使丛书能不断完善和提高,为促进大学英语教学 和大学生英语水平的提高,提供尽可能多的都助。

国家教育部于1999年颁布实施的新的《大学英语教学大纲 (修订本)》(高等学校本科用)指出,大学英语教学的目的是"培养 学生具有较强的阅读能力和一定的听、说、写、译能力,使他们能用 英语交流信息。大学英语教学应帮助学生打下扎实的语言基础,掌 握良好的语言学习方法,提高文化素养,以适应社会发展和经济建 设的需要"。与原理工科和文理科大纲相比,新大纲提出的要求和 指标均提高了。如培养学生能用英语交流信息这一要求,比原来的 "以英语为工具获取专业所需要的信息"的目标提高了,内容拓宽 了,这不仅要求学生顺利阅读,而且要求听懂英语并用英语进行口 头或笔头表达。除教学目的之外,新大纲对四级听力速度的要求从 原来的每分钟 120 词提高为每分钟 130~150 词。把四级阅读的速 度从每分钟50词改为每分钟70词。对语法的要求从"侧重语法结 构在语言交际活动中的运用"转向"提高在语篇水平上运用语法知 识的能力"。对词汇的要求从掌握3800~4000单词改为领会式掌 握 4 200 单词。把四级写作的速度从在半小时内写出 100 词左右 的短文提高到在半小时内写出 120~150 词左右的短文。把翻译的 要求从原来的"能借助词典将与课文难度相仿的文章译成汉语,理 解正确,译文达意,笔译速度达到每小时300英语词"改为"借助词 典将难度略低于课文的英语文章译成汉语,理解正确,译文达意, 译速每小时 300 英语单词。能将内容熟悉的汉语文字材料译成英 语,译文达意,无重大语言错误,译速每小时250汉字"。

本书的编写以新的《大学英语教学大纲(修订本)》(高等学校本科用)为标准,以国家教育部公布的各类题型为依据,测试范围涉及了大纲规定的一至四级说以外的全部内容。尤其是考虑到了新大纲在各项测试指标和要求上的变化。所设计的测试题目难易

度适中,覆盖面广,针对性强,信度和效度把握得当,各试卷之间尽量避免重复。为了便于考生自学和自测,本书对考题的测试要点和疑难点进行了有针对性和指导性的解析,同时提供参考答案、参考译文、参考范文和听力文字材料,并配有听力和听写部分的录音。旨在提高考生的语言应用能力和应试能力,帮助考生顺利通过国家的英语四级考试。

本书编写者都是多年从事大学英语教学、经验丰富、教学效果优秀的一线教授、副教授和讲师。共编写考题 20 余套。孙秀丽、栾述文、姜忠全同志对全部试题进行了审阅、调整、合并、删减、增补、修改、统编和定稿。最终从中精编了全新仿真模拟题 10 套,选编国家正式考题 2 套,便于全真测试。

鉴于不同的教学要求和不同读者的需要,本书分为两种版本: (一)模拟试题、参考答案、疑难解析和听力文字材料合订为一册; (二)模拟试题与其他部分分开装订。前一种版本便于读者自测之 用,后一种版本有利于教学使用。读者和教学单位可以根据不同的 要求选购版本。

本书主要供非英语专业的大学本科生作为四级考试考前自测练习和模拟训练的教材,同时可以作为研究生和出国人员的英语学习自测书和复习指导参考书。亦可以作为大学英语教师的教学辅助教材。

本书中的疏漏或不当之处,恳请广大读者及同行专家赐教指正,以期进一步修改完善。
