前 言

《初中英语阅读 300 篇》自 2000 年 11 月出版以来,已多次重印,得到读者的广泛欢迎和好评。由于所编内容及语言程度适合初中学生的需要,不少学校将本书指定为初中学生的主要英语课外读物,影响遍及全国各地。继后编者又编写出版了《初中英语听力 300 题》、《初中英语综合知识 300 题》、《初中英语完形填空 300 题》、《初中英语写作 300 篇》、《初中英语语法 300 题》和《初中英语词汇 300 题》等书。本套丛书在全国中学生中产生了一定影响。

近年来,我国英语教学形势发展很快,教育部新制订、颁发的 《国家基础教育阶段英语课程标准》,对英语教学,特别是英语的阅 读能力和英语课外阅读量提出了新的要求,做出了具体规定。教 育部对初中毕业生要达到的英语三级,提出课外阅读量应达到 10 万字以上,而上海及沿海发达地区的要求则更高一些。考虑到随 着各地英语教学水平的提高及新版教材的使用,几年前出版的《初 中英语阅读 300 篇》已不能完全适合当前初中学生扩大英语阅读 量的需求,而且不同地区、不同学校及不同年级也对英语阅读提出 了不同的要求。为此编者趁势对本书做了一次全面的修订改版。 新版《初中英语阅读 300 篇》共分两卷,其中"基础卷"保留了原书 较多的内容,删除和更新了原书中内容较陈旧、篇幅过短,已不符 合目前初中阶段教学需要的洗篇,主要供一般中学的初中学生使 用。"提高卷"全新收集了反映当前国内外发展潮流的时文,编写 了大量不同种类的习题,主要供初三毕业生及重点中学的初中学 生使用。一般初中学生使用过"基础卷"后,如果感到学有余力,可 继续使用"提高卷"。

修订后的"基础卷"保留了原书的特色,语言难度仍控制在一般初中生的阅读能力之内;新增的文章还注重了练习的多样性,例

如简答、排序等,目的是将阅读能力的提高与考试的要求结合起来。

本书由冯大雄、俞珮华主编,杨扬、卢璐、俞海英、王美华、汤华、陈婕编写,黄教英、毕铭等协助搜集和整理资料。

期盼读者能继续喜爱并使用本书,并恳望得到教师同行与广 大读者的批评指正。
