Let's try our best! Make our dreams come true! Follow our dreams to find the future that belongs to us and mankind!

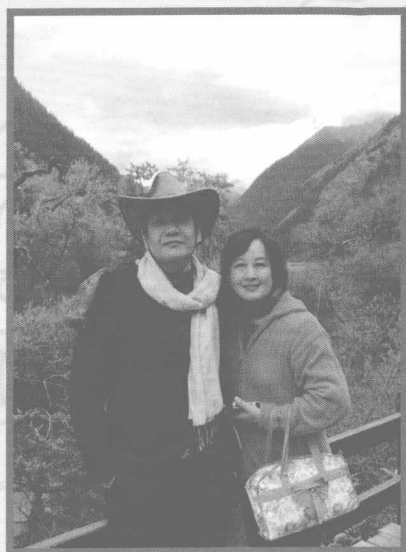

His representative works are "Dreams of Enlightenment" and "A Classic Collection of the World Famous Dreams of Famous People."

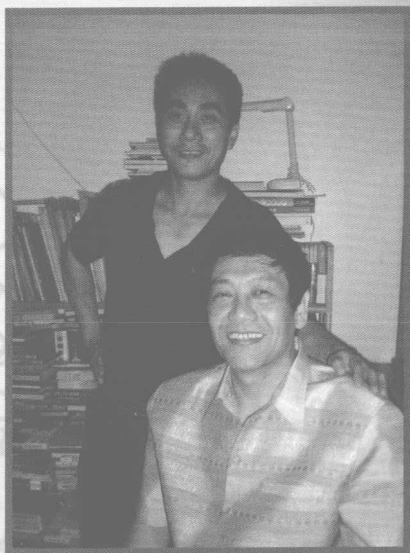

### 几何学与代数

法国哲学家、科学家、数学家笛卡尔 Rene Descartes（1596年-1650年）

青年时代的笛卡尔，因不满意欧几里德的几何学和当时的代数学，一心想寻找另一种包括这两门科学的优点而没有它们缺点的办法。

昼有所思，夜有所悟。1619年11月一个夜晚，他连续做了三个奇特的梦。

第一个梦是：自己被风暴从教堂的学校驱逐到风力吹不到的地方。

第二个梦是：自己得到了打开自然宝库的魔钥。

第三个梦是：自己背诵奥生尼的诗句“我应该沿着那条人生之路走下去？”

正是因为这三个梦，笛卡尔明确了自己的人生之路，这梦中所指的是他一生中思想的转折点，梦中的魔钥就是解析几何的线牵。



## **geometry and algebra**

Rene Descartes (1596-1650) is the French philosopher, scientist, and mathematician.

In his youth, Descartes, as dissatisfied with the Euclidean geometry and algebra at that time, was obsessed with the idea of searching for another solution which would combine the merits of the two and drop their flaws.

As the old saying goes, whatever haunts you in the day would come into your dreams at night.

One night in November, 1619, Descartes had three strange consecutive dreams:

First, he dreamed himself being repelled away by the storm from a church to somewhere the storm can't reach; second, he dreamed that he got the magic key to the treasure trove of the nature; third, he was reciting a line from Nepal's poem:

" Which way shall I go down in my life?"

It is because of these three dreams, Descartes found his way of life, and the meaning of the dreams was the turning point of his thinking, the magic key in the dream became a lead to the analytic geometry.
