总 序

应试指导

听力考试的第一部分为新闻听写。此部分共有三条新闻,以国内、国际的重大事件为主,包括政治、经济、军事、科技、体育、文娱和自然灾害等方面的内容。三则新闻有 24 个空格,每空一分,共 24分。录音播放前有 60 秒的准备时间,考生可充分利用这段时间浏览考题,以便知道这三条新闻的大致内容,防止听录音时措手不及和过度紧张。录音播放两次。

每空基本上只填一词,根据以往的考题分析来看,所填的词多为实词,如名词、动词、形容词等,当然,介词也不容忽视。


第一部分考前复习需注意的地方阐述如下:

1. 考生应在考前坚持收听英语广播,如 BBC 和 VOA,当然也可以 收看电视英语新闻,如 CCTV 9 和上海卫视的 News at Ten 等节目,使自己熟悉英语新闻的文体和相关词汇。英语新闻写作一般 采用"倒金字塔法"和"时间顺序法"两种结构。"倒金字塔法"以

- 导语(lead)为全篇重点,最次要的内容置于末尾(ending)。 "时间顺序法"则按照事件发生的先后顺序来报道,不到末尾难以知晓新闻事实的最终结果。
- 2. 培养自己收听、收看新闻时做笔记的习惯,学会抓新闻的关键词。 因为考试时所填的空多为关键词,考生平时可加强这方面的练习。
- 3. 考前多阅读中英文报纸。虽说是听力考试,但通过阅读,能很大程度上帮助考生了解新闻背景,熟悉相应词汇,从而使考生在考场上从容镇定。考生尤其应该关注考试最近几个月的时事。
- 4. 考试要特别注意新闻节目中有关国际关系、突发性事件和灾难事故的报道,并熟悉相关的词汇。

那么,在听录音填词时,考生又需注意什么呢?

- 1. 因为录音播放两遍,第一遍时考生可在题卷上填写空格。
- 2. 一定要充分利用 60 秒的准备时间浏览考题,做到心中有谱。考试时,空格不会密集,所填词多为一个。考生在填写上一个单词时,手中一边写,眼睛要扫视到下个词的位置,切不可光顾着填写而溃漏听下个词。
- 3. 如果听到一个词,只觉熟悉,片刻之间却不能反应上来,就应该放弃该词。不可因苦苦思索而耽误下个词的听写。
- 4. 听录音时,如果来不及写下完整的单词,可根据读音写一个发音 类似的词,或可能的话暂时记下该单词大概的音标待第二遍时更 正或补充。我们不提倡写首字母,因为首字母并不足以提醒考生 该词。同时,录音结束后,考生也可根据语法检查所填单词,如单 复数、时态,甚至是固定词组的搭配等等。

考前准备中考生应注意的地方阐述如下:
