

#### 前言

《最新大学英语词汇与语法结构系列教程》是哈尔滨工程大学出版社继《大学英语听力系列教程》和《大学英语阅读系列教程》之后又推出的一套供高校公外学生使用的新教程。三套教程紧密相连,互利互补,为学生在校两年基础英语学习阶段打好坚实的语言功底、顺利地通过全国四、六级统考、准备研究生和出国留学考试提供了可靠的保证。

众所周知,对任何非母语语言的学习都要从词汇开始,不断地发展扩大,同时要以语法为准绳有机地综合运用,熟能生巧,才能使学习外语有了充分的保障。因此,任何类型的考试都离不开"词汇"与"语法"两项测试内容。全国四级英语统考上两项占 30 道题,占试题总数的 1/3,可见其比重之大。为达此目的,我们根据《大学英语教学大纲》及《新附词汇表》和各类考试的实际要求,对大学英语四级各个级别需要掌握的每个语法项目和每一个单词,分别编写了典型练习题,构成本套系列教程。全书按难度分为四册,每册对应同一级的程度。对某些重点语法、词汇还根据其常用义项的不同搭配,编了各个习题。每册 16 个单元,每单元 100 道习题;每四个单元编有一套测试题,同时对四个单元中的难点做了注解,并附有答案,测试题的难度建立在每四个单元的基础之上。

读者在做每一个级别的练习时,最好是把全部单元做完, 弄明白每一个选项的含义,对与错的依据是什么。只要作到这 一点,就完全覆盖了该项考试的全部词汇、语法内容,可以胸 有成竹地参加相应级别的考试。本书既可在课堂上作为补充 教材或计时测试,也可作学生的课外自修材料。

本书是我省多所高校外语界教师又一次合作的结晶。虽 经多方努力,但不足之处仍然很多,望广大读者阅后指正。
