

全新版前言

《新闻英语视听说》(全新版)是依照教育部2007年7月颁布实施的《大学英语课程教学要求》编写的一套高级新闻英语视听说教材,适用于大学英语较高或更高要求阶段、研究生英语阶段和其他高级英语阶段的学习者。全新版教材在2004年出版的第1版教材的基础上更新了听力素材,使之更具时代感。同时,对练习进行了重新编排,从而更好地满足新闻英语的教学需求。

《新闻英语视听说》(全新版)取材于近年来欧美澳主要英语国家各大电视媒体的公开放送内容,目的是帮助大学生熟悉和掌握各种新闻英语的特点,进一步培养和提高英语语言技能,从而听懂英语国家的广播电视节目,及时了解现代资讯,灵活自如地使用英语进行国际沟通。

《新闻英语视听说》(全新版)教程视听一体、内容新颖、题材广泛、语言规范、实用性和趣味性极强。本教程配有约4小时的原声剪辑光盘,音质优美,以现代美语为主,并涉及不同的英语变体。本教程着力于提高学习者的新闻英语视听技能和口语表达能力,注重前沿资讯、国际交流、风俗习惯、文化背景等知识,以适应不同场合的英语视听任务和口语交际活动。

《新闻英语视听说》(全新版)共有16个主题单元,涉及政治、经济、文化、教育、娱乐、体育、科技、自然等方面,形式多样、内容丰富,基本满足各种情形下的新闻英语需求。本教程所有视听材料均有注解、听力脚本和中文翻译,练习配有参考答案,以便学习者自主学习和课堂任务检查。教程注重在语言、内容和语体等方面由浅入深、循序渐进,教师和学习者可根据具体情况进行适当调整,有目的、有选择地使用本教程内容。

Brown assumed office in June 2007, after the resignation of Tony Blair and three days after becoming leader of the governing Labor Party. Before this, he served as Chancellor of the Exchequer in the Labor government from 1997 to 2007 under Blair. 戈登 布朗
- Tony Blair is a British politician, who served as Prime Minister from 2 May 1997 to 27 June 2007. He was the Member of Parliament for Sedgefield from 1983 to 2007 and leader of the Labour Party from 1994 to 2007. 托尼 布莱尔
- Iraq /rˈrɑːk/ is a country in the Middle East, on the Persian Gulf. Baghdad is the capital and the largest city. It's known as one of the world's most unstable countries. Beginning with the invasion in 2003, a multinational coalition of forces, mainly American and British, occupied Iraq, which has had wide-reaching consequences. 伊拉克
- The Guardian is a British newspaper owned by the Guardian Media Group. It is published Monday to Saturday in the Berliner format from its London and Manchester headquarters. 《卫报》

As the wife of Bill Clinton, the 42nd President of the United States, she was the First Lady of the United States from 1993 to 2001. She was a leading candidate for the Democratic presidential nomination in the 2008 election. 希拉里·克林顿
- CNN, Cable News Network, is a major US cable news network founded in 1980 by Ted Turner. 美国有线电视新闻网
- South Carolina /ˈsauθˌkærəˈlamə/ is a state in the southern region (Deep South) of the United States. It borders Georgia to the south and North Carolina to the north. Columbia is the capital and the largest city. 南卡罗莱纳州
- YouTube is a video sharing website where users can upload, view and share video clips. 优酷 视频分享网站
- Broadway theatre, commonly called simply Broadway, refers to theatrical performances

- presented in one of the 39 large professional theaters with 500 seats or more located in the Theatre District, New York (plus one theatre in Lincoln Center) in Manhattan, New York City. - The G.O.P., or the Grand Old Party refers to the Republican Party, one of the two major contemporary political parties in the United States, along with the Democratic Party. POW is the abbreviation of **prisoner of war**. It is a combatant who is held in continuing custody by an enemy power during or immediately after an armed conflict. 战俘

Montana /mon'tænə/ is a state of the northwest United States bordering on Canada. Helena is the capital and Billings the largest city. (美国)蒙大拿州

The Jonas Brothers are an American pop-rock boy band. The band gained their popularity from the Disney Channel children's television network. The band consists of three brothers: Kevin Jonas, Joe Jonas, and Nick Jonas. 乔纳斯兄弟乐队

Beyoncé is an American R&B singer-songwriter, record producer and actress. She rose to fame in the late 1990s as the lead singer of the girl group Destiny's Child and the success of her subsequent solo albums has then established her as one of the most marketable artists in the music industry. 碧昂斯
