

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总序

经过几年的快速发展,我国教育已进入高等教育大国的行列,按照党的十七大精神,向建设人力资源强国迈进。数以千万计的学生在各级、各类高等学校学习各种知识和培养能力,为成为社会主义的建设者和新时期的应用型人才而努力。高等教育从"精英化"到"大众化"的转变,除了数量的扩大外,必须在培养目标、教学内容、教学方法、教材等方面进行改革,以适应培养不同类型人才和不同类型高校的教学需要。

独立学院自开办以来,在教学各方面,特别是教材基本沿用了普通本科的教学资源,这给特色教育和定向教学带来了诸多不便,难以达到教委设定的教学目的。有鉴于此,我们在"服务于地方,培养应用型人才"这一总的目标指导下,组织了一批教学经验丰富、致力于教学改革研究、在相关课程方面有较深造诣的教师,按教育部的教育培养规划,编写了这套适合独立学院本科教学的系列教材,旨在有针对性地培养应用型高等学历人才,因此我们称这套教材为"普通高校应用型人才培养规划教材"。

我们编写这套教材的基本思想是:对基本原理、基本理论,重在结论和应用。理论部分遵循教学大纲,不求深入全面,但求适用,对相关理论做必要的引介。书中编列了较多的例子和习题,增加了学生自我训练、独立解题的素材,期望帮助学生加深对理论知识的理解和应用。我们力求这套丛书在内容结构上既区别于传统本科教材,又不同于高职高专教材。在理论知识方面既有一定的系统性,也兼顾了现代性;既注重知识间的逻辑性,也突出了知识的应用性;在够用、实用、适用的前提下,还编入一些有深度知识的链接,供要求进一步提高的学生自学之用。本套教材在文字上力求准确易懂,适当增加例图,有较好的可读性,便于学生自学。

由于我们的水平有限,书中难免出现一些问题,敬请各位教师和广大学生给予细心的指正和热情的帮助。在此,对于大力支持这套教材出版发行的经济科学出版社也一并表示真诚的感谢。

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《英语视听说教程》是一本根据新的教学理念,集视、 听、说于一体的适合于独立学院英语专业学生入学阶段强化 训练的教材。旨在让学生接受与中学阶段完全不同的英语学 习方式,为后期的英语教学作一个过渡和铺垫。本教材分为 学生用书和教师用书各一册。

《英语视听说教程》(教师用书)对照学生用书分为相应的12个单元,每单元按Background knowledge, Reference Key, Listening Scripts及Translation的顺序进行编写。本教材内容可安排96学时,为期8周时间完成。具体做法是,每周12学时,其中视听6学时,视说4学时,语音2学时。该学时安排的框架在使用过程中可根据各校具体情况自行调整。在使用本教师用书时,授课教师应注意以下几点:

- (1) 在授课过程中,教师应引导学生听懂书中的视听材料,指导学生口头表达材料的主旨大意、相关细节,做到复述基本正确。
- (2)在句子跟读环节,教师不仅要注重句子的准确性,还应该鼓励学生认真模仿语音、语调以及感情色彩。
- (3)在视听、视说每个单元中,我们编写了Additional Listening Material和Additional Video—audio Material,老师在授课时可以选择使用,时间充裕时,可以作为正常教学材料,也可以作为家庭作业让学生课后练习使用。

- (4) 听力技巧的掌握是学生今后英语学习的基础,教师应该首先吃透书中的讲解,结合自己的经验,在课堂上精讲多练,还可以课后推荐英语学习网站,经典练习书籍供学生课后进行巩固练习。
- (5) 充分利用语音训练2学时,帮助学生了解学习语音的重要性,打好语音、语调基础,注意纠正学生常见的孤僻发音、课程结束时可进行班级语音比赛。

参编者均为视听、视说、语音课的任课教师,通过实践,他们 积累了较丰富的经验。而本教材正是各位教师教学理念、教学方法、教学研究的集体结晶。本书的听力和视频部分的文字材料由Phillipa, Peter, Jennifer, Tim和Sean校对,对此,我们表示衷心地感谢。

由于编者水平和经验有限,教材中难免还有不足之处, 希望各位读者不吝赐教。
