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前言

《大学英语四级听力模拟题集》是根据《大学英语教学大纲》的规定和要求,针对大学英语四级考试(CET-4)的考生进行设计的。其目的在于帮助学生进行专门的听力技能训练,提高学生的听力理解水平。为了提高学生动笔的实际能力,除保留原有的A节对话、B节短文以外,还增加了C节填空式听写(Spot Dictation),D节复合式听写(Compound Dictation)和E节复述式听写(Repeat Dictation)这三种新的听力题型。

本书最大的特点是题型新颖,内容广泛,既包括国内外的风土人情,传统性节假日的来历以及幽默小故事,又为学生提供了大量的实践练习,帮助学生提高应试能力,为顺利通过全国大学英语四级统考奠定基础。

本书由朱雪珍副教授担任主编。叶齐华、周光明两位副教授担任副主编,参编者有朱雪珍、邓晓红、曾文华、丰国欣、李丽华、宗志珍。
