KING LION

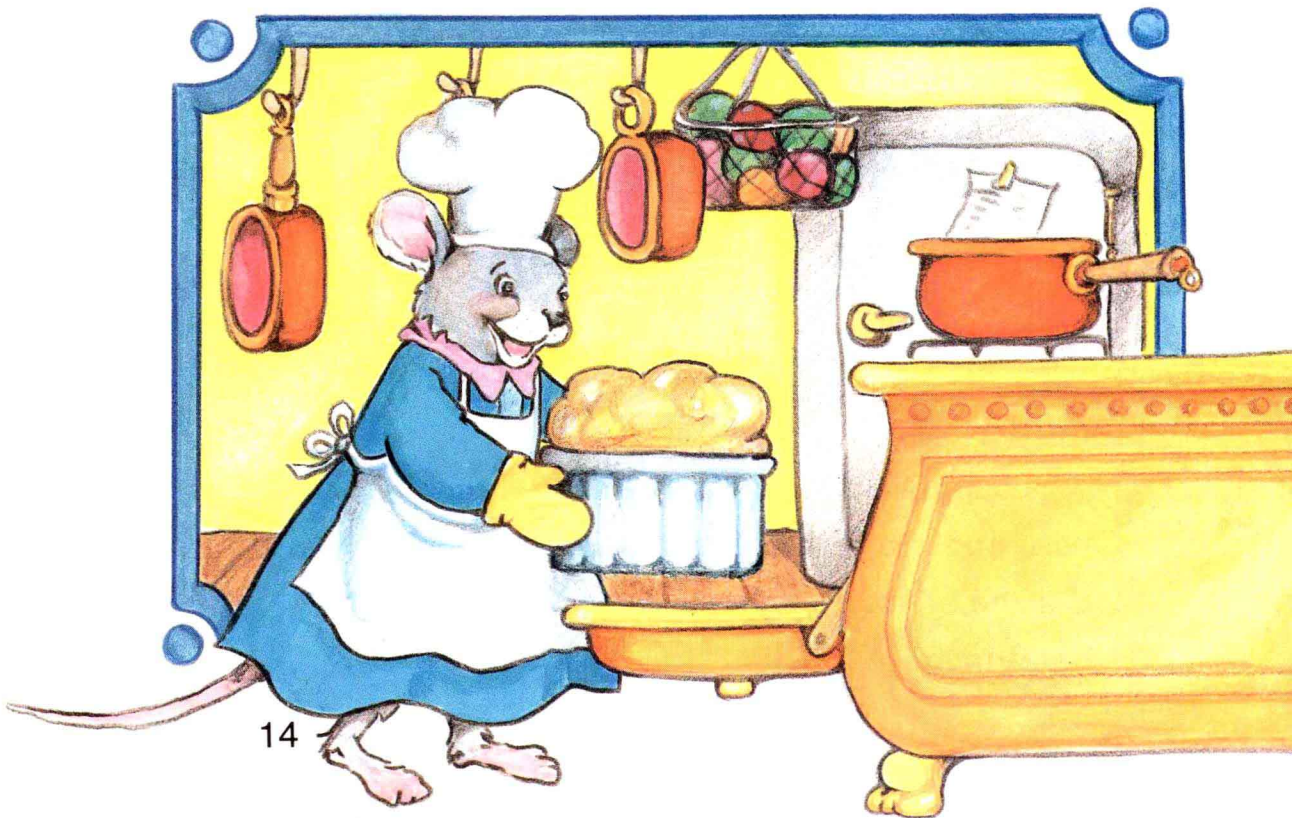
and His Cooks
