

#### 出版说明

本世纪四十年代后,随着语言理论和外语教学法的发展,英、美、 澳等国先后出版了大量英语教材。这些教材在编写原则、词汇选择、 课文设计、操练体系以及视听材料配套等方面都呈现了新的面貌,为 非英语国家人民学习英语提供了更有科学性、系统性和易接受性的教学材料。由英国著名语言学家 L. G. Alexander 编著、英国朗曼公司出版的《新概念英语》(New Concept English) 就是其中的一种。

《新概念英语》 共分四册,第一册 《入门必读》 (First Things First) 是入门读本,第二册 《实践与提高》 (Practice and Progress) 是向中级水平过渡的读本,第三册 《技巧发展》 (Developing Skills) 为中级水平读本,第四册 《流利英语》 (Fluency in English) 可达到初级英语证书的水平。

本书作者 L. G. Alexander 一九八一年春在上海外国语学院讲学时提出,外语教学要解决的两个根本问题是教什么和怎样教,这两者之间的相互作用即构成语言教学的核心。作者在编写《新概念英语》时就以这个原则为出发点。整套教材的特点是取材新颖,语言地道,课文剪裁合宜、短小精悍、含蓄幽默。本教材十分重视听说训练,L.G. Alexander 在教材的前言中提出上课的原则应该是"未听过的不说,未说过的不读,未读过的不写。"正因为如此,教材于1967年出版后(第三册"Developing Skills"首版于1964年)为世界许多国家所采用,以后逐年重印,历久不衰。

为适应我国广大读者的需要,我社于 1982 年按原教材的开本出版了英汉对照本。这次再版,我们特请上海外国语学院讲授这套教材多年的英语教师重新翻译课文,提供必要的背景知识注释,并附有各课练习答案,以供读者参考。
