



Constellations of the Southern Hemisphere.




Fig. 2.—The Syon Cope. (English, 13th Century.)

The medallions with which it is embroidered contain representations of Christ on the Cross, Christ and St. Mary Magdalene, Christ and Thomas, the death of the Virgin, the burial and coronation of the Virgin, St. Michael and the twelve Apostles. Of the latter, four survive only in tiny fragments. The spaces between the four rows of medallions are filled with six-winged cherubim. The ground-coloured silks. The lower border and the orphrey with coats of arms do not belong to the original cope and are of somewhat later date. The cope belonged to the convent of Syon near Isleworth, was taken to Portugal at the Reformation, brought back early in Kensington Museum.




Fig. 3.—Cope of Blue Silk Velvet, with Appliqué Work and Embroidery.




Fig. 4.—Cope of Embroidered Purple Silk Velvet.




Fig. 21.—Grave-Statue.




Fig. 10.—Blowing Room.




Fig. 11.—Carding Room.
