



Note: The order in which the *tests* or *sections* appear may vary, as there are several different forms of the NTE.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The NTE Core Battery is 6 hours long and is composed of three two-hour tests, each having four sections. The first test (although not necessarily given first) is the **Test of Communication Skills**. It is 2 hours long and contains about 105 questions, plus one essay topic. It is divided into 4 sections, each 30 minutes long, as follows:

Listening—about 30 questions, requires the ability to understand spoken messages quickly and accurately

Reading—about 30 questions, requires the ability to read and answer questions based on short written passages

Writing—Multiple Choice—about 45 questions, requires the ability to detect and correct errors in standard written English

Writing—Essay—requires the ability to plan and write a well-organized, careful essay on an assigned topic

The second test is the **Test of General Knowledge**. It is 2 hours long and contains about 120 questions. It is divided into 4 sections, each 30 minutes long, as follows:

Social Studies—about 30 questions, requires a competence in a broad range of social studies areas as well as the ability to interpret and analyze data

Mathematics—about 25 questions, requires a cumulative knowledge of math in order to solve problems of a type any teacher may need for the classroom

Literature and Fine Arts—about 35 questions, requires a basic knowledge of major works and basic elements of literature and fine arts

Science—about 30 questions, requires an understanding of major principles, theories, and methods in the area of science.

The third test is the **Test of Professional Knowledge**. It is 2 hours long and divided into 4 sections. Each section is 30 minutes in length and contains approximately 30 questions. All parts of this test draw on the knowledge that is considered essential for a beginning teacher. Areas such as planning instruction, implementing instruction, evaluating students' work, appropriate professional behavior, and legal implications in the classroom are some of the fields covered.
