# INTRODUCTION

Most of the words that cause spelling trouble are listed here and they are dealt with in four different ways

#### Traps

Are there two g's in exaggerate? Is gauge an -AU- word or a -UA- word? We often know what the traps are, but we don't know how to avoid them. That is why words are listed in families in this section, grouped in spelling traps.

#### Words that confuse

This section lists words that are often mixed up. For example, it sorts out altar/alter, and to/too/two, and other tricky sets of words that bother a lot of people

#### Spelling list

When we misspell a word, we don't get all of it wrong We slip up at the 'accident spot(s)' In this section, all the commonly misspelt words are listed, and every one has its accident spot(s) underlined.

#### Rules to remember

Many spelling rules are complicated and there are many exceptions to most of them – words that look as if they ought to obey the rules, but don't The rules included here are the simple ones and each one deals with a basic spelling point

If you tackle spelling along these lines you'll solve many everyday spelling problems.
