## Welcome<sup>1</sup>, Little Friend from Africa!

#### Characters:

Bessie: an African girl of thirteen

The teacher

The monitor: a boy of eleven

Pupils A, B, C...

Monitor: (comes out in front of the curtain and stands in the middle of the stage.) We are pupils of Grade Four. Now we are going to put on a short sketch,<sup>2</sup> "Welcome, Little Friend from Africa!"

(The curtain rises. The scene is a beautiful courtyard of a primary school. On the wall is a slogan, "Welcome, Little Friend from Africa!" Enter the pupils.<sup>3</sup> The monitor joins them.)

Pupil A: Get ready, boys and girls. Our African friend will be here soon.

Pupil B: Look! Here she comes with our teacher.

Monitor: Line up,4 everybody.

(Enter Teacher and Bessie.)

Pupils: (clapping) Welcome! Welcome, little African friend! (They say this several times.)

Boys: Welcome to China!

Girls: Welcome to our school!

Monitor: We're very happy to meet you.

Bessie: I'm also very happy to meet you.

Pupil A: What's your name?

Bessie: My name is Bessie. I'm thirteen...

Pupil A: I'm eleven. You are two years older than I am.

Teacher: Come along, children. Now you can introduce<sup>5</sup> yourselves to our African friend.

Pupil B: My name is Zhang Ping. I'm also eleven. I'm a Young Pioneer.

Pupil C: My name is Xiao Ling and his is Da Qi. We're classmates.

Pupil D: We're all in the Fourth Year.

Bessie: What do you study at school?

Pupil B: We study Chinese, Arithmetic, ...

Pupil D: And English.

Pupil C: Yes, of course. And we like English very much.

Bessie: Oh, you all speak English so well.

Pupil A: Can you understand our English?

Bessie: Yes, very well. And do you understand my English?

Pupils: Yes, when you speak slowly.

Monitor: We're working very hard at our English because we want to make friends with the people of other countries.

Pupil B: And we also want to learn from them.

Bessie: I'm here to learn from you.

- Pupil A: Where is your country, Bessie? Is it far from China?
- Bessie: Oh, yes, it's very, very far away. There's no winter there and it never snows. It's summer all the year round.
- Pupils: How interesting! Do tell<sup>7</sup> us more about your country and your people.

Bessie: I will.

- Pupil A: Bessie, are you going to tell your people about China when you go back?
- Bessie: I certainly will. I've seen so many things since I came to Peking. I've been to factories, hospitals, beautiful parks, the Great Wall, and today I've come to your school. I'm going to tell everybody at home about what I've seen here.8
- Monitor: We are so happy that we have now become good friends. Shall we sing and dance together?
- Pupils and Bessie: Yes, let's! (They sing and dance.)

## Catching the Rat

#### Characters:

The Little White Kitten

Uncle Cock

Rabbit

Other kittens

Chicks

The Rat

#### Scene:

When the curtain rises the chicks and kittens are singing and dancing in front of the barns. Behind the barns are big trees and blue hills.

(Enter the Cock.)

Cock: Good morning, children.

Chicks and Kittens: Good morning, Uncle Cock. We've been waiting for you. What shall we do today?

Cock: Today we are going to glean the wheat fields.2

Chicks: Let us chicks do it. We can pick up wheat quickly with our sharp beaks.<sup>3</sup>

Cock: All right. But be careful not to leave a single grain in the fields.

Chicks: No, we won't, Uncle Cock. (Exit the chicks.)

Kittens: What shall we do, Uncie Cock?

Cock: Kittens are good at catching rats. Your job is to guard the barns.

Kittens: All right. We'll do a good job.

One kitten: There are three barns, and we've got three kittens. Let each kitten guard a barn.

Another kitten: That's a good idea. I'll go to the first one.

Another kitten: I'll go to the second one.

Cock: So Little White Kitten will stay here. Can you do the work alone, my little sister?

Little White Kitten (L.W.K.): Yes. I am the youngest. But I am brave. Don't worry about me.

Other kittens: Let's run to our barns. (Exit.)

Cock: Little kitten, this is the first time you've looked after a barn. The big Rat often comes here to steal our grain. You must be careful.

L.W.K.: When the Rat comes, I'll catch him.

Cock: Good, see you later. (Exit.)

L.W.K.: I am all alone now. I must be very careful. (Sings to herself.)

I am a brave little white cat.

I am learning to catch the rat. (Enter the Rat.)

Rat: Good morning, Little White Kitten. What a nice day it is!

L.W.K.: Yes. It's lovely today. But may I ask who you are and what you've come here for?

Rat: Me? I'm your uncle. Why,5 don't you know your own uncle? Anyway I know you very well.

L.W.K.: Do you?

Rat: Certainly. And I know your mother too.

L.W.K.: My mother?

Rat: Yes, your mother has a round face and a pair of green eyes.

L.W.K.: Yes, you're right. That's my mother.

Rat: When you were a baby, I often carried you on my back and took you out to play.

L.W.K.: So, you are really my uncle.

Rat: There is no doubt about it.

L.W.K.: Excuse me, Uncle. I am sorry I didn't recognize you. Why don't you go and see my mother, Uncle? My home is quite near and we've some fish.

Rat: I'm busy today. I'll come some other day. Goodbye, little kitten. (Exit.)

L.W.K.: Good-bye, uncle. Why hasn't the Rat come, I wonder? Is he hiding somewhere in the barn?

(She looks for the Rat.)

(Enter the Cock.)

Cock: Little Kitten, have you caught the Rat?

L.W.K.: No, the Rat didn't turn up.7 But just a minute

ago my uncle came.

Cock: Your uncle? You never had an uncle. What does he look like?

L.W.K.: He has a sharp face, grey skin and a long tail just like a piece of string.8

Cock: That was none other than the Rat.

L.W.K.: Really?

Cock: The Rat is very sly. He often disguises himself as 10 a good person. You mustn't be taken in 11 by him.

L.W.K.: I'll know him when he comes next time.

Cock: All right. I'll see how the other kittens are getting on with<sup>12</sup> their work.

L.W.K.: How silly I am. I am really ashamed of myself<sup>13</sup>.

(Enter the Rat.)

Rat: Aha! You lazy Little Kitten. Why are you sitting there doing nothing?

L.W.K.: I am waiting for the Rat.

Rat: The Rat? Will he come here?

L.W.K.: Yes, here he is. (Catches the Rat.)

Rat: You silly Little Kitten. You must respect your uncle.

L.W.K.: You are not my uncle. You are the Rat. I won't be taken in this time.

Rat: (Cries.) Have mercy, 14 Little Kitten. Have mercy on me. I'll never steal again.

L.W.K.: Do you mean what you say?15

Rat: Yes, yes. I swear<sup>16</sup> never to steal again.

L.W.K.: In that case<sup>17</sup> I'll let you go. But be careful not to come here again.

Rat: Thank you, Little Kitten. Thank you, kind-hearted<sup>18</sup> Little Kitten. (Exit.)

(Enter the chicks.)

One Chick: Come on, chicks. Let's pile the grain here.

Another chick: Have you caught the Rat, Little White Kitten?

L.W.K.: Yes, but I let him go.

Chicks: What? You let him go? Uncle Cock, come here! (Enter the Cock.)

Cock: What's the matter, children?

Chicks: Little White Kitten caught the Rat, but she let him go.

Cock: Why did you do that? Come on and tell me, child.

L.W.K.: He said he would never steal again.

Cock: Oh, you silly child! He was telling a lie.

(Enter the Rabbit with a sack on his back.)

Rabbit: Look, Uncle Cock. Here's a sack of sesame. 18

Cock: Where did you get it?

Rabbit: The Rat stole it. I tried to catch him. He left the sack and ran away.

Cock: See what the Rat has done. We must catch him. Let's put the sack here and hide. I am sure he'll come for it. (They all hide. Enter the Rat.)

Rat: Aha, my sack of sesame. (Smells it) It smells wonderful, and will taste nice. Ha, ha, ha! I'll take it home now. It can last me the whole winter.20

(Enter L.W.K.)

L.W.K.: Don't move. This time I caught you red-handed.21

Rat: Oh, my kind-hearted Little Kitten. Let me take it home or I'll starve.

L.W.K.: Don't play any trick<sup>22</sup> again. I've seen through<sup>23</sup> you.

(Enter the other animals.)

Rabbit: Fasten<sup>24</sup> his hands and feet. Here is a piece of rope.

Cock: Little White Kitten, you've learned a good lesson<sup>25</sup> today. To be a good child, you must be able to tell good people from bad people.<sup>26</sup>

L.W.K.: I'll remember what you said, Uncle Cock.

Kittens and Chicks: We'll all remember what you said.
