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
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
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Introduction



Introduction



The creation of residential spaces for individual clients can place architects/designers in a sometimes difficult but certainly always challenging position. They are obliged to tailor their own creative talent and training so as to provide designs, which while inspired by their own attitudes, imagination and experiences, meet the frequently heavy constraints of the client's brief.

Obviously, when creating a livable environment to suit the stated desires of an individual client, constraints like the budget, site, aspect, access etc., must be taken into account. More important though for the architect/designer of an individual home is to be able to blend these practical considerations with the use of light, space and materials, the essential elements of architecture, so as to develop a response which aspires to elevate the design, and in turn the client's own view of the resulting environment, beyond the ordinary.







