PREFACE

* This volume continues the series Operations Research An Annotated Bibliography to include material published through 1961, including references and annual additions to material previously published, and follows essentially the same plan. The criteria for inclusion has been that the author or editor has indicated that the work concerns Operations Research or that it has been cited in support of such work as fully detailed in the preface to the preceding volumes. This includes all articles from all operational research journals contained in the list of abbreviations.

The intention remains to include all articles on or related to operations research, liberally construed to include the various equivalent terms (not all generally so accepted). Related specialties such as cybernetics, linear programming, queueing, and the like, already the subjects of separate bibliographies, are in general omitted except where actually used in operations research, as are purely mathematical derivations and proofs unless given a solution to a specific operational research problem or type. Some exceptions have seemed desirable.

The abstracts aim to present in condensed form an adequate indication of the author's objective, nature of the problem, approach adopted, the mathematical or other techniques used or suggested, and the results obtained. This provides sufficient information to select for direct consultation the papers pertinent to the interest of the reader whether professional or layman.

Readers and authors will confer a favor by calling attention to any errors or omissions noted so they may be corrected.

Abstract. Complex mathematical formulas are usually omitted for simplicity. They are to be found in the original article. Abstracts in other than English or French are usually translated. Number of references

Reviews, comments, and other annotations.

The contents of the volume are arranged in three sections: subsequently published additions to entries in the previous volumes; abstracts 8320 through 9838 comprising the body of the work; and an index. Following the index is a list of errata applying to this and previous volumes already published.

Subsequently published additions to entries in volumes 1 through 3 are arranged in numerical order, using the same serial number of the original entries to which the additions belong.

Entries beginning with 8320 are arranged alphabetically by primary author, journal or institution. Diacritical marks in foreign languages have mainly been eliminated.

The index, arranged alphabetically, contains separate entries for secondary authors; titles of books, articles or papers (omitting the definite or indefinite article); subject; and entries descriptive of the content, which may be helpful.

Authors of abstracted articles listed in the index are made in all capital letters. Reviewers are in lower case letters, unless the reviewer is also an author, in which case the entry is made in all capital letters.

Titles of articles are identified through underscoring, while subject matter of the index is not underscored.

Since the additions are in three separate alphabetical groups as alphabetized in Volumes 1, 2 and 3, through using a continuous numerical sequence, it is felt to be advantageous to the user to list <u>all</u> authors of these additions, together with the titles of the articles, in this index.

To locate a particular known article, search the index in the following manner:

- 1. Title of the article
- 2. Name of one of the multiple authors
- 3. Some principal word of the title

To find an unknown article, or explore an area, select a probable subject or related subjects and search the index.

The index is in a single alphabetical order showing authors, titles and translations of titles, and other index subjects. This usually will locate quickly the reference desired.
