

#### Preface



- 1. 本书紧扣最新《教学大纲》和《英语专业四级考试大纲》,实用性、针对性强。

- 3. 本书以周计划的形式进行编排,每周安排两套模拟试卷,每套试卷前配有一部分试卷分项解读,使考生在备考的过程中将复习和训练有机地相结合,通过四周的复习和练习提高专业考试成绩。
- 4. 本书在对解题技巧详细阐述的同时,注意培养考生的语言能力,并向考生介绍正确的学习方法。
- 5. 本书模拟试题严格按照最新英语专业四级考试的模式,在选题上把握难易度,阅读选材涵盖面广,内容新颖。
- 6. 本书的听写和听力理解部分附有 MP3 音频文件,请在浙江大学出版社网站上 (www.zjupress.com)下载。该音频由美国文教专家 Courtney Cruzan 和 Jason Cruzan 夫妇录制。新闻部分材料全部选自近期的 VOA 或 BBC。



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

#### 英语专业四级考试简介

全国高校英语专业四级考试(Test for English Majors [Grade Four],简称 TEM-4)是为检测本科英语专业基础阶段教学大纲执行情况而进行的本科教学考试。国家教育委员会《高等学校英语专业基础阶段英语教学大纲》规定,高等学校英语专业基础阶段的教学任务和目的是:"传授英语基础知识,对学生进行全面的、严格的基本技能训练,培养学生实际运用语言的能力,培养学生良好的学习作风和正确的学习方法,培养学生逻辑思维能力和独立工作能力,丰富学生社会文化知识,增强学生对文化差异的敏感性,为学生升入高年级打好扎实的基础。"

#### 一、考试目的

本考试的目的是全面检查已学完英语专业四级课程的学生是否达到教学大纲所规定的各项要求,考查学生运用各项基本技能的能力以及学生对语法结构和词语用法的掌握程度,既测试学生的综合能力,也测试学生的单项技能。同时,也是评估教学质量,推动校际交流和学习的一种手段。

#### 二、考试性质

本考试属于尺度参照性标准化考试。考试的范围包括基础阶段教学大纲所规定的一至四级除读和说的技能以外的全部内容。由于目前尚未具备口试的条件,暂且只进行笔试。

#### 三、考试形式

为了较好地考查学生运用各项基本技能的能力,既照顾到科学性、客观性和可行性,又能全面体现基础 阶段英语水平测试的特点,同时为确保试卷的可信度,本考试除写作及听写部分为主观试题外,其余都采取 多项选择题形式。主观试题部分旨在较好地测试学生灵活运用语言的能力,从而提高试卷的效度。

#### 四、考试时间



#### 六、考试要求

听写	(a)要求学生在全面理解为所听内容的基础上逐字逐句写出全篇短文; (b)拼写和标点符号正确无误,错误率不超过 8%; (c)考试时间为 15 分钟。
听力 理解	(a)要求能听懂英语国家人士关于日常生活、社会生活的讲演或交谈等材料,其难度相当于 TOEFL 中的 minitalk 等中等难度听力材料,理解中心大意,抓住主要论点或情节,能根据所听材料进行推理和分析; (b)能听懂 VOA 或 BBC 国际新闻的主要内容; (c)考试时间约为 20 分钟。
完形 填空	要求考生在全面理解所给短文内容的基础上选择一个最佳答案使短文的意思和结构恢复完整。考试时间为 15 分钟。
语法 及词 汇	(a)能灵活正确运用教学大纲语法结构表一级至四级的全部内容; (b)熟练掌握教学大纲词汇表对一级至四级规定的 5000—6000 个认识词汇中的 2000—2500 个词汇及其最基本的 搭配; (c)考试时间为 15 分钟。
阅读理解	(a)能读懂英美国家出版的中等难度的文章和材料,掌握所读材料的主旨和大意; (b)了解说明主旨和大意的事实和细节; (c)既理解字面的意思,也能根据所读材料进行一定的判断和推论; (d)既理解个别句子的意义,也理解上下文的逻辑关系; (e)考试时间为 25 分钟。
写作	(a)要求根据所出的题目和所列的写作提纲或图表、数字统计表等(也附有写作提纲)写一篇 200 词左右的短文。要求做到内容切题、完整、条理清楚,文章结构严谨,语法正确,语言通顺恰当。考试时间为 35 分钟; (b)要求根据提示写 50—60 词的通知、便条、请帖等。要求格式正确,语言得体。考试时间为 10 分钟。


