Alexandre Dumas

Alexandre Dumas was born near Paris in 1802. His grandmother was a Haitian slave, and his father, a general in the French army, died when Alexandre was only four. As a child, Dumas was poor, and had little education, but when he was twenty he went to live in Paris and soon became successful both as a playwright and a novelist. His most famous books, *The Three Musketeers* (1844) and *The Count of Monte Cristo* (1845) are both available in the Bookworms series. Alexandre Dumas died in 1870. His son, also called Alexandre, was a successful novelist, too.

1802年,大仲马(即亚历山大·仲马)出生于法国巴黎附近。他的祖母是一名海地黑奴,父亲是一位法国陆军将军。父亲去世时,大仲马年仅四岁。幼年的大仲马生活贫困,几乎没受过什么教育。二十岁时他移居巴黎,不久后其戏剧、小说的创作便大获成功。《三个火枪手》(1844)和《基督山伯爵》(1845)是大仲马最具盛名的两部小说,"书虫"系列均有收录。大仲马于1870年去世。他的儿子,也就是小仲马,同样也是一名成功的小说家。




'Leave it to me,' said Milady.

'Can't you tell us why?' asked Athos.


'The Queen needs our help. That's all I can say.'
