本套丛书的编写紧扣 CET 和 TEM 大纲中关于听力类题型的相关要求,把相关的听力技巧与听力技能的训练融入到相应的练习题中,使考生通过一段时间的强化训练,充分熟悉和掌握 CET 和 TEM 中的各类题型和训练要点,做到有的放矢,强化提高。

本套丛书的编写不同于一般的听力训练书籍,它不是进行泛泛的听力题海战术,而是以 CET 和 TEM 的实际要求为出发点,目标明确,所有题目的知识点和难点设置都以实际考试为参照,力求让考生在最短的时间内取得最好的效果。

全书的所有听力材料都采用原汁原味的地道英文,同时还配有听力训


