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前言

英语专业考研和我们平时的普通考研英语是截然不同的。普通考研英语是针对那些报考非英语专业的考生所进行的英语水平测试,由教育部统一出题,主要考查大学英语的基本知识。而英语专业考研是针对报考英语专业研究生的考生而进行的考试,难度大,参考书目多,基础知识在考试中显得尤为重要。加之在一些院校中,英语专业考研不像其他专业一样公布考研参考书目和试题,这更使得英语专业考研变得越来越神秘难测。

掌握词汇是学好外语的先决条件,它就仿佛是一座大楼的根基。而且,词汇学习绝不像某些人想象的那样,背背词汇表就行了。学习词汇如同了解一个人,要分两个阶段:先要知其相貌,进而熟其脾性。对于词汇学习,"知其相貌"就是要记住词汇的形、音、义、性"熟其脾性"则是要进而了解其所属语域(正式、口语、俚语、粗俗等)、专业领域(医学、物理、天文、音乐、摄影等)、用法、搭配等。当然,正如我们不可能、也没有必要深入了解我们见过的每一个人一样,对于有些词汇混个脸儿熟即可。而考试大纲撤销了词汇释义的信息告诉我们,考生不仅要牢牢掌握每个大纲单词的字典本义,也有必要了解其在上下文中的特定含义。

本书以英语专业四级、八级、部分 GRE 词汇为基础,再补充一些经常出现于文学作品和评论中的词汇,以及从历年各校英语专业考研入学考试试题中萃取的易考词、常考词和难词,适合英语专业本科毕业后有意攻读英语专业研究生的同学使用。一个英语专业的本科毕业生在基本掌握专八词汇的基础上,简单记忆本书所列词汇后,词汇量即可扩大到 16000 以上,足以应对全国各级研究生院的人学考试。

本书与其他图书相比,具有以下一些特点:

1. 全——内容全面

本书不仅包含大纲所有词汇,还对历年考题涉及的词汇进行科学分类, 同时为熟词生义和词义多变的词汇短语配以丰富例句。

2. 多——一书多用

本书例句均来自涉及多个学科专业的国外最新书刊,以及各大院校的 历年真题。读者不仅可以利用真题例句作为英译汉练习,更可结合词汇本 义意译真题以检验自己的阅读翻译水平,真正做到一书多用。

3. 易——记忆容易

本书浓缩词项,以熟词带生词,以生词记熟词,减轻考生记忆负担,尤其 对考研新手和在职考生,背单词不再是任务,而成需求。这样,考生就能够 在短时间内获得"与众不同、名副其实"的速记效果。

4. 便——使用方便

书中对每个 点词汇均有涉及,结合各个高校真题进行剖析,内容全面,使考生实现真正意义上的高分突破,享受"一书在手,全部拥有"的自豪感。
