前言

《高级职业英语》(Advanced Career English)是一套专门针对高职高专学生实际的公共英语系列教材。其编写历经两年之久,经过了大型调查研究,获得了大量客观可靠的数据和访谈笔录,并在此基础上进行了科学的定量和定性分析。其编写理念是在对用人单位、毕业生、在校生和教师及教学管理部门进行调查的基础上,采取"能力倒推"的方法,即根据调查统计结果筛选出毕业生实际工作岗位所涉及的岗位英语技能点,再根据目标工作岗位群的特征,将这些技能点按照语言教学的客观规律进行科学的编排和语言精加工,整合成具有共性特征的技能模块,从而形成教材的主要架构。

本系列教材依据教育部颁布的《关于全面提高高等职业教育教学质量的若干意见》,遵循"面向社会,针对岗位,强化能力,促进发展"的宗旨,坚持"能力本位、任务驱动、行动导向、教学做一体化"的教学模式和以岗位技能为主线,以职场活动为情景的编写原则,构建"基于工作过程的项目导向"的内容体系,紧扣岗位需求,做到"学中做,做中学",以"学以致用"、"学以管用"、突出技能训练、全面提高学生完成岗位工作能力为目的。

本教材形式新颖,按照听说模块、读写模块和拓展模块分项编写,内容贴近岗位需求,具有独到的针对性和实用性,为学生通过本教材的学习,掌握职场生存和发展必需的英语基本技能提供了可靠的保障。

本系列教材借鉴国内外优秀教材的编写经验,由外籍语言专家审定把关,是一套专为高职高专院校非英语专业公共英语教学量身打造的综合英语系列教材。

《高级职业英语》系列教材共三级,每级由《听说教程》、《读写教程》、《拓展教程》以及《教师参考书》组成,同时增加了《预备教程》可供入学水平较低的使用者选用。本系列教材每单元围绕同一职业岗位技能展开训练,每个教程既相对独立,又相互联系和互为补充,从而形成一个有机的整体。

《听说教程1》(Listening and Speaking 1) 共由3个部分组成:

Section 1 Before-class Activities: Getting Things Ready (课前活动: 做好准备) 供学生课前预习使用,目的有两个:一是为课堂训练做好必要的准备,二是培养学生自主学习能力。包括3个学习活动: Activity 1 Listen and Look (看图练听),其内容为与本单元岗位技能训练相关的8-10个关键性单词和词语,让学生一边听录音,一边看图做匹配或填空练习。Activity 2 Listen and Repeat (听与跟读),其内容为本单元岗位技能训练相关的10个核心句子,让学生在课前反复跟读直至能脱口而出。Activity 3 Speak Out (开口讲),内容是一个精心设计的帮助学生开口说英语的活动。

Section 2 In-class Activities: Things to Do (课上活动:需要完成的任务)以多种方式训练学生完成本单元岗位技能的听说能力,是各单元的主要内容,供课堂训练用。包含3个学习活动: Activity 1 Task Check-up (任务检查)供教师在课堂上检查学生课前任务完成情况,为下面互动交流起到热身作用。Activity 2 Interactions (互动交流)包括5个训练任务,重点训练学生口头表达能力。Activity 3 Listen Out (精听)有4个训练任务,从短对话、长对话到短篇三个语篇层面着重训练学生的听力。

Section 3 After-class Activities: Listen for Fun (课后活动:歌曲欣赏) 是课后训练,通过让学生课后听精心选取的英文歌曲来学习英语,一方面陶冶情趣,另一方面帮助增强语感。

《高级职业英语》系列教材由广东警官学院向前进教授担任总主编。《听说教程1》由广东行政职业学院余培英担任主编,张苑红担任副主编,参加编写的有刘冬、杨旭、余艳娟、李俊、吴秀、李娜、申伟、赖毅生、邓玉梅。




