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前 言

2005 年 2 月教育部颁布了四、六级改革方案,其核心是:2006 年 1 月考试(试点)起,四、六级考试成绩将采用满分为 710 分的记分体制,不设及格线;成绩报道方式由考试合格证书改为成绩报告单,报道内容包括:总分和单项分。四、六级考试将加大听力理解部分的题量和比例,增加快速阅读理解测试,增加非选择题的比例。试点阶段的四、六级考试有四部分构成:听力理解、阅读理解、综合测试和写作测试。听力理解部分的比例提高到 35%,其中听力对话占 15%,包括短对话和长对话。听力短文占 20%,包括短文听写和选择题。

为了适应改革的要求,本书针对四级新题型听力部分进行自测训练。依据新题型设计了 20 套全真模拟听力测试题,每套题包括:A 部分 10 个短对话和两个长对话;B 部分两篇短文;C 部分一篇短文听写(复合式听写)。

为便于读者做题,本书对测试题进行了详细的解释并附有文字材料。同时为了便于读者了解新题型,在书的最后给出了大学英语四级新题型样卷一套。本书难度循序渐进,既可作为课堂教学辅助教材使用,也适合学生自主学习。
