FOREWORD

We live in an “infotainment” age where information is delivered as entertainment for better efficiency. In today’s hectic world, in order for information, of any sort, to be readily acceptable and absorbed, it has to be tailored in a way that attracts the recipient’s attention. The same principle applies in the education field.

In today’s China, students are overloaded with coursework delivered in a routine and boring fashion. Many students easily sleep through or even skip classes. This book’s objective is to remedy that kind of situation in the English learning area. The principle it adopts is instruction through entertainment; the students have fun while learning.

The main problem that non-native speakers of English, such as Chinese students, encounter when learning English is the lack of speaking practice. This problem is the result of an outdated education that has emphasized learning by rote. Students may accumulate a lot of knowledge, but they don’t know how to express it.

This book is all about practicing and honing the students’ speaking skills. Through the games in this book, the students will enjoy having fun and competing with one another. Without even realizing what they are doing, the students will develop speaking fluency and confidence through this method. Nothing can bring a shy student out of his shell more easily than a fun game of English.

I have tried this book with students who came from all levels of education, not only from the university but also from high school and middle school. The students enjoy playing different games. This book contains more than forty games, thus, providing a rich variety to keep any class interested. Again, while the games cover different strategies and areas, they all have the same purpose: making the students practice their speaking skills.

This book can also be used as a self-study tool since the answers are included.

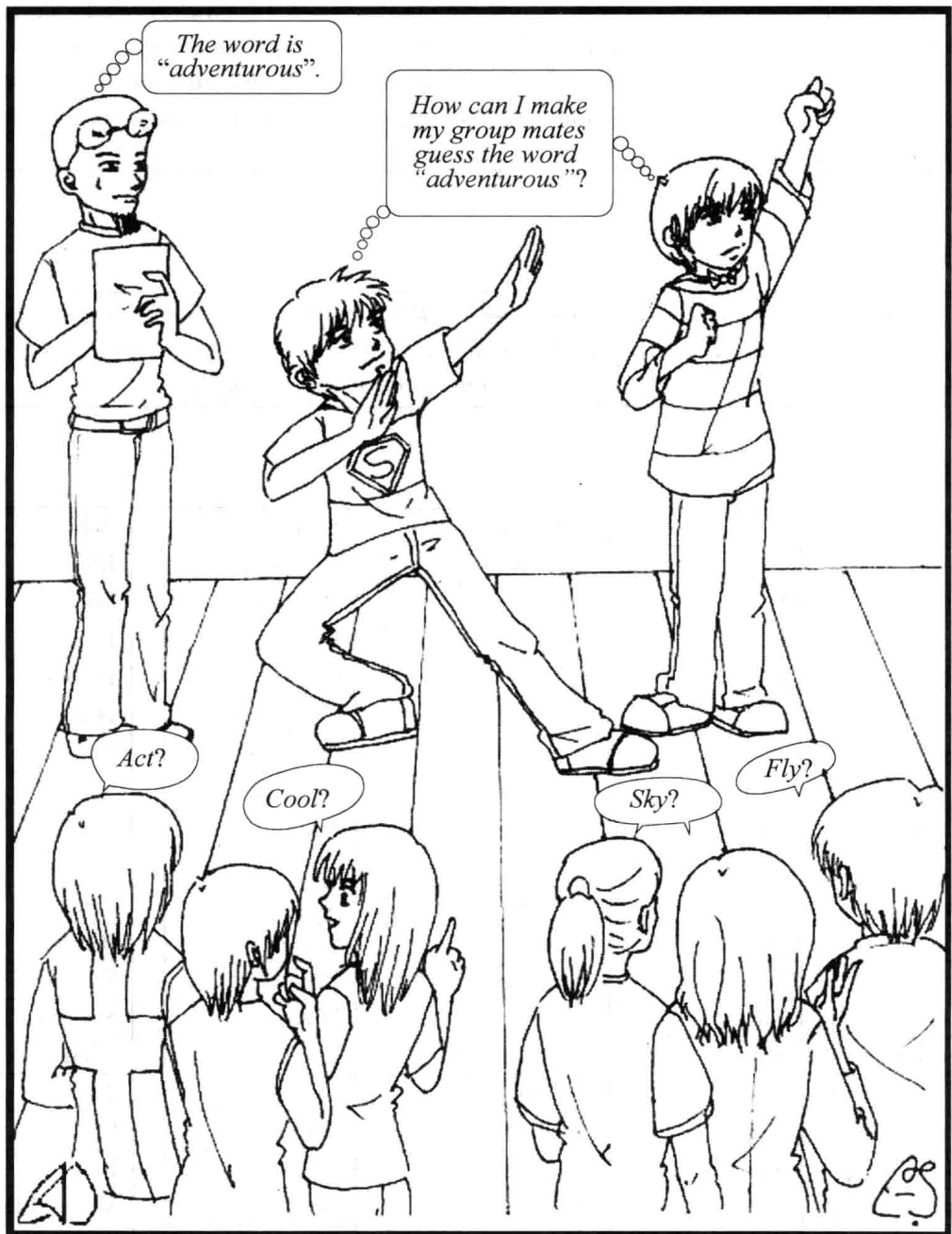

GAME 1

GUESS THAT WORD



GAME NAME: GUESS THAT WORD

HOW TO PLAY

The class is divided into two groups. Each group sends a representative to the front of the class. The teacher shows a word to the representatives who try to explain it to their groups and make them guess the word. The same word is simultaneously shown to both representatives in order to maintain fairness. The group, which first guesses correctly, gets a point. Then, the next word is shown and the game goes on. From time to time, the groups should change their representatives in order to give a chance to all group members to participate.

EXAMPLE

Depending on the English proficiency level of the class, the words can be chosen from the following lists for beginner, intermediate and advanced levels. Note that the words are not arranged alphabetically or by topic so as to make the game more challenging.

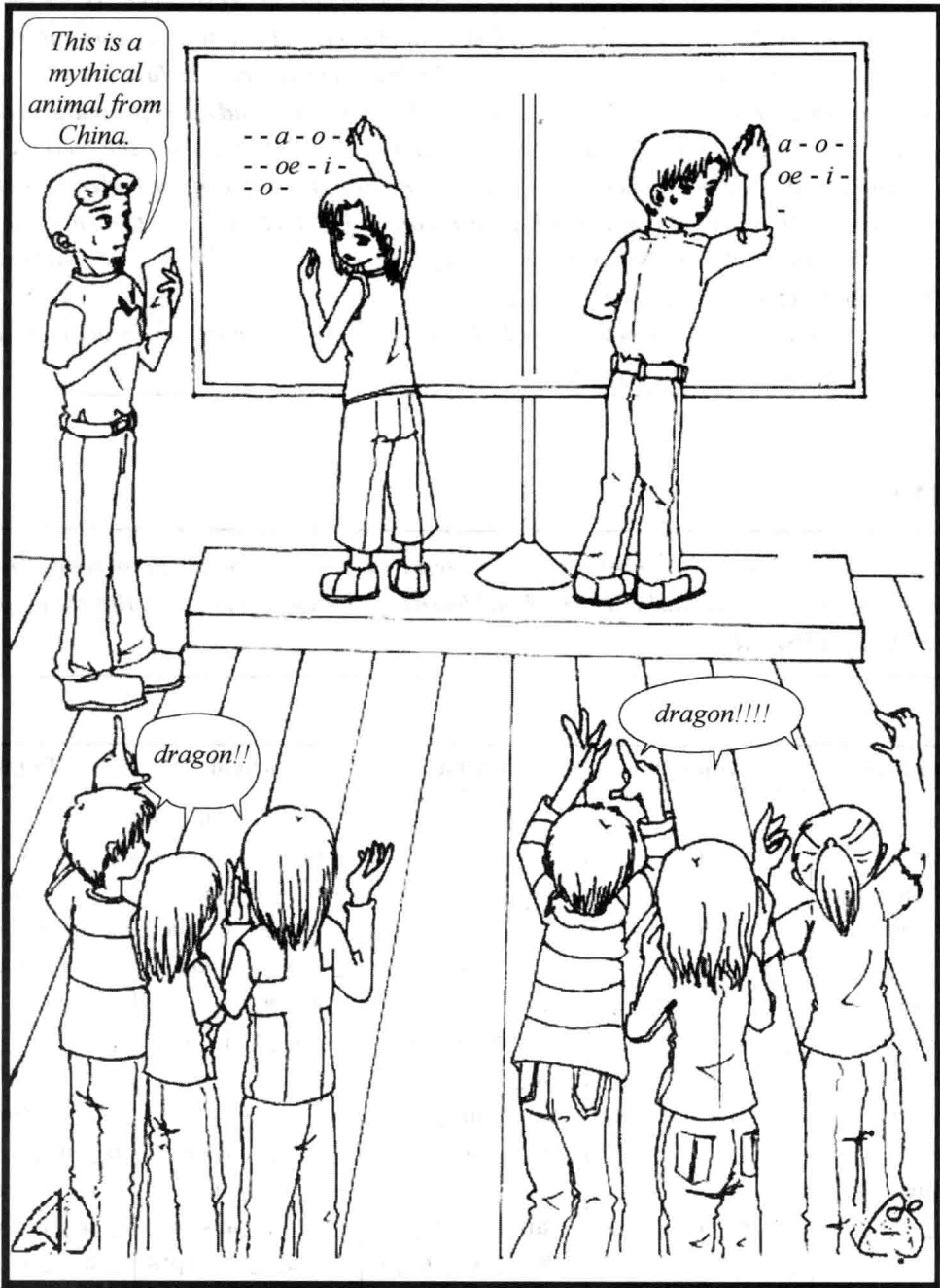

GAME 2

COMPLETING WORDS



GAME NAME: COMPLETING WORDS

HOW TO PLAY

Before this game begins, the teacher draws a vertical line in the middle of the blackboard to divide it into two equal halves. Then, he/she writes lists of words, with blanks in them, on each half of the board; for example, a word such as "keyboard" might be written as "_ ey _ oa _ _". Each list is about one topic, such as computers, animals and so on. The words on both halves of the blackboard are similar.

Next, the class is divided into two groups. Each group sends a representative to the front of the class. The two representatives stand next to their half of the board, ready to fill in the blanks. The teacher gives clues about the first word in order to help the representatives fill in the blanks. Each group can shout help to its representative. The party, which first fills in the blanks correctly, gets a point. Then, the teacher gives clues about the next word and the game goes on.

From time to time, the groups should change their representatives in order to give a chance to all group members to participate.

EXAMPLE

Examples of this game follow below. First, the teacher writes these word lists, or a subset of them, on each half of the blackboard. The word lists are the same on both sides of the blackboard.
