FOREWORD

This book is divided into thirty units. Each unit includes the following sections: Discussion topic, American style, Get wise with proverbs, American slang, Pronunciation and Homework. The topics, proverbs and slang are all covered in an alphabetical way for easy reference.

This book is the result of the author's first-hand experience in teaching English to Chinese students for so many years. The author has taught students from all backgrounds including university students, high-school students and professionals. The book includes all the essentials to improve the student's English speaking ability.

As mentioned earlier, the book is divided into thirty units. Each unit includes the following sections.

<u>Discussion topic</u>. This key section allows the student to analyze some very popular topics in depth. Key words and focus questions are provided to help and guide the student in the discussion.

<u>American style</u>. This section introduces American culture as it relates to the discussion topic in the previous section. This information aims to satisfy the curiosity of the student about life in America.

<u>Get wise with proverbs</u>. This section provides the student with another way to get another feel for the American culture. While proverbs are international in nature and apply to human experience in general, many proverbs in this section provide a window into understanding American and Western culture.

<u>American slang</u>. Very few books introduce slang to Chinese students. Slang is very important if a Chinese student is to fully master English. Slang is the way people talk in everyday life. The slang expressions in this section allow the student to be better equipped when it comes to communicating with Americans.

<u>Pronunciation</u>. This section addresses the particular needs of the Chinese student as they relate to speaking English. Specific examples are provided to allow the student to practice.

<u>Homework</u>. This section includes exercises about vocabulary, proverbs, slang, and composition. This section will make the student review the contents of the unit, thus reinforcing the learning process.

WHY IS THIS BOOK SO UNIQUE?

What makes this book so unique is the fact that it integrates the material that students are very interested in, specifically ways to allow them to communicate about the most popular topics and to understand the daily language used by native speakers. In order to accomplish this task, this book includes the following sections: Topic discussion, American Style, Proverbs, American Slang, Pronunciation and Homework.

Topic Discussion is the fun and flexible way to allow students to become more fluent in English. In order to be proficient in English, the students are expected to be able to smoothly communicate in a variety of situations. This book facilitates this task by introducing thirty popular topics that everyone needs to be able to talk about. A key attribute of this book is that each topic is introduced with a long list of keywords needed to discuss the topic. In addition, in order to guide and stimulate the student discussion, a list of ten questions is provided with each topic.

<u>American Style</u> is an up-to-date, insightful and comprehensive view of American culture. For each topic discussed in the previous section, the American perspective is presented. Students get to know about such popular American culture aspects as sports, music, food, love and so on.

<u>Proverbs</u> act as a window into a language. Learning them allows the student to gain a wider appreciation of American culture. The most common proverbs are introduced in this book. In order to engage the student, the proverbs are presented as a multiple-choice cloze, thus requiring the student to choose the correct answer from a list of related choices. The answers are included in the Appendix at the back of the book.

Slang is the way people talk in everyday life. Slang is what students hear when they watch a movie or a TV show. Slang is what students see when they enter an online English chat room. Slang is what students hear when they see American expatriates or tourists talking in China. Slang is what students will hear when they go to the United States. Unfortunately, the great majority of English textbooks exclusively concentrate on introducing formal English, and thus, the students are sometimes left without a clue when communicating with Americans. This book introduces the most common slang expressions as used in everyday life situations. In order to stimulate the student's thinking and increase word retention, the meaning of the slang expressions is given in a multiple-choice format. The answers are included in the Appendix at the back of the book.

<u>Pronunciation</u> is the key to letting others understand you. While all foreign students share some pronunciation difficulties, Chinese students have some specific pronunciation problems. This book introduces thirty pronunciation hints to help the Chinese student tackle these mistakes.

<u>Homework</u> is used to enhance and reinforce the student's grasp of topic vocabulary, proverbs and slang. The answers are included in the Appendix at the back of the book.


