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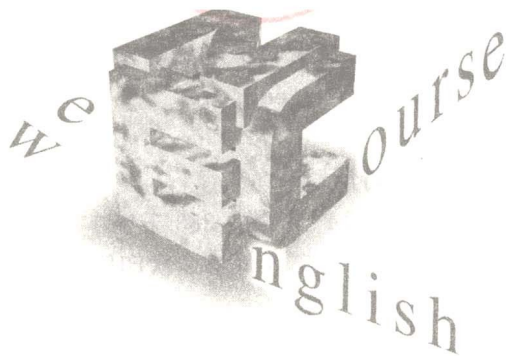
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### 内 容 提 要

本书为《新英语教程》(第三版)主干教材《阅读》第三、四册的补充练习。练习形式均为客观型的多项选择题。第三册有 10 套练习,第四册有 8 套练习,分别与教材中的各单元相对应。每套练习均由阅读理解、词汇、语法结构和完形填空 3 个部分组成。

本书可作为课堂练习的补充,也可作为完成单元学习后的自测试题集。书末附有全部练习的答案。

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# 使用说明

本书是与《新英语教程——阅读》(第三版)第三、四册配套的补充练习册。由于教材中的练习多为主观型题,本练习册全部采用客观型的多项选择题,以满足教师和学生在教与学中的不同需要。本书包含两册,第三册有 10 套练习,第四册有 8 套练习,分别与教材中的各单元相对应。每套练习由三部分组成。

第一部分为阅读理解 (Reading Comprehension), 共 20 题,用以检查对教材中的 Part A、Part BI、Part BII、Part BIII 各课课文的理解。

第二部分为词汇和语法结构 (Vocabulary and Structure), 共 40 题,用以检查对教材中各课课文的词汇的掌握情况。

第三部分为完形填空 (Cloze), 短文的题材与教材中的课文相近。文中可能会有少量生词,都有中文注释。要求填充的 10 个空中,实义词和结构词各占一定比例。此项练习有助于全面考核学生综合运用语言的能力。

每套练习为 100 分,既可作为学完一个单元后的测试题,也可在学习过程中选用相应部分作为课堂练习的补充或课外作业。书后附有全部练习答案。

本书各部分素材均选自原文书刊或词典,语言地道,内容丰富。练习为作者自编。由于水平有限,一定有不少失误之处,敬请使用此书的老师和同学指出,我们将在重印时改正。

### Part III Cloze (2 × 10 = 20 points)

**Directions:** Each blank in the passage is provided with four possible choices. Read the whole passage and choose the best answer for each blank.

The ability to spot the writer's purpose is especially useful in reading newspaper headlines because headlines can serve different purposes. A careful reader is always on watch (1)\_\_\_\_\_ what the headline writer is trying to do. The first purpose of a headline is to (2)\_\_\_\_\_ the reader by summing up the story it covers. Usually this is done with great skill, but sometimes the whole story cannot be (3)\_\_\_\_\_ in a single phrase or sentence. If there are several (4)\_\_\_\_\_, the headline writer must select the most important one to write about.
