#### **Preface**

The Third Edition of Dermatology in General Medicine is a major revision with 60 additional chapters and 120 new contributors. Through this edition we are attempting to keep pace with new developments in dermatology: aging of the skin; pathophysiology of pruritus; physiology and pharmacology of the skin including cutaneous circulation, hormone receptors, and metabolism of drugs: chemical and viral carcinogenesis; dermatopathology; therapeutics including topical and systemic therapy, especially recently introduced modalities such as PUVA photochemotherapy, retinoids, cytotoxic agents, antiviral agents, and pharmacokinetics in relation to topical therapy; benign and dysplastic melanocytic nevi; cutaneous aspects of cardiopulmonary diseases, cutaneous manifestations of immunodeficiency disorders.

Some of the chapters and sections in this edition are, in fact, monographs with detailed documentation, some chapters have been completely rewritten by new authors, and others have been extensively revised and updated. The discussion on photomedicine has now been expanded to ten chapters.

Special features are an Atlas of Common Skin Disorders with 36 new color plates, a new color Atlas of Cutaneous Manifestations of Multisystem Disease with detailed legends, and a new color Atlas of Clinical Recognition of Primary Melanoma and its Precursors.

The new edition again presents comprehensive discussions of the basic sciences as they relate to the skin and its pathophysiology, and we have included those disorders limited to the skin such as psoriasis and eczema and a major consideration of the cutaneous manifestations of diseases in other organ systems.

Although the book is aimed primarily at the dermatologist, it should also be valuable for medical students, general internists and medical specialists (gastroenterologists, rheumatologists, endocrinologists, and infectious disease physicians), primary care physicians, pediatricians, neurologists, pathologists, surgeons, psychiatrists, and dentists.

The editors are deeply grateful to Patricia K. Novak who has assiduously assembled all three editions of this textbook.
