#### Introduction

The Learn and Act series is based on the idea of helping the child to learn words and constructions through what may appear to him as play. It lends itself to all kinds of activities that appeal to any child. Hence, questions after each section have been avoided.

Each lesson or exercise should be looked upon as a guide to the teacher, who, in his or her turn, is advised to give further practice based on the same idea.

Lessons dealing with "Do and say" or "Read and act" require use of objects to illustrate words given; also use of the blackboard and movement. They should never be dealt with as mere reading lessons.

When teaching the words this and that, these and those, the child should be made to touch the object or picture in the case of this or these, and point to it from a distance in the case of that and those.

Lessons dealing with questions and answers should be read by two children, one giving the question and the other the answer. After a reading lesson of this type, the class should be encouraged to give the same questions and answers from memory by just looking at the pictures.

This book of the *Learn and Act* series deals with the simple present and present continuous tenses, and allows for plenty of practice in speech. The teacher may add to the vocabulary such words as "please", "thank you", "Good afternoon" and "Goodbye".
