### Introduction

#### Who this book is for

This book is for anyone who has studied English for at least two years, but who lacks confidence in written English. School learners, adults and businessmen will all improve their written English through using this book.

#### What this book contains

This book contains twenty chapters of increasing difficulty which review many of the grammatical problems that cause difficulty in writing English, and which give you practice in writing English precisely and clearly without making errors. Different types of writing are practised; description, letter writing, free expression, reported speech, etc.

#### How to use this book

Follow the instructions in each unit carefully. For most units you must first study and copy the model composition which appears at the beginning of the unit. Study the model composition until you are familiar with all the sentences and structures which appear in it. Next you must copy out the model composition exactly as it appears in the book.

Then answer the questions which appear below the model composition. Use the words in the brackets to help you answer the questions, but you cannot always use the same sentences that are used in the model composition to answer the questions. Write out your answers so they form a paragraph and not a series of separate sentences.

After the questions there are a number of different grammar exercises. These give practice in some of the patterns which are used in the model composition and which you will make use of in the *Picture Composition* section.

An exercise called *Picture Composition* follows the grammar exercises. This is a story told in pictures. Look at the pictures and the words given in English below the story and try to write a sentence or sentences to go with each picture.

Lastly there is a free composition section suggesting topics for you to write about.
