2) Teams listed on the left side in this schedule shall wear dark colour and teams on the right side shall wear light colour in the competition.

3.Competition Sites and Equipment

3.1. Competition Sites

The 1st East Asian Games' basketball competitions will be held in Yang Pu Gymnasium and Hong Kou Gymnasium. Yang Pu Gymnasium is

located in the east of Shanghai, about 5km from Lantian Hotel. It has a seating capacity of 4000. Special areas will be reserved for VIPs and journalists in the gymnasium. Changerooms and showers for athletes will be available.

Hong Kou Gymnasium is located in the northeast of Shanghai, about 3km from the Lantian Hotel. It has a seating capacity of 3,500. Areas for VIPs and journalists, changerrooms and showers for athletes will be available.

3.2. Competition equipment

3.2.1 The FIBA approved "Train S241S" basketball made in China will be used as the competition ball.

3.2.2. The "Jin Ling YLJ-5" backboard made in China will be used in the competitions.

3.2.3. All the equipment used in the competition is in conformity with the FIBA Rules.

4.Training Sites and Equipment

4.1. Training Sites

4.1.1. Basketball Gymnasium in the Shanghai Physical Culture and Sports Institute which is at the northeast suburb of Shanghai has four training courts. It is about 3km from the Lantian Hotel.

4.1.2. Jiangwan Gymnasium at the northeast suburb of Shanghai has one training court. It is about 2km from Lantian Hotel.

4.1.3. Shanghai No.2 Normal School's Gymnasium which is at the east of Shanghai has one training court. It is about 4km from Lantian Hotel.

4.2. Training Equipment

The floor, balls, backboards and lighting will meet the requirements for training.

5.Registration

5.1. The competing teams must arrive at the competition hall 30 minutes before the start of the competition and check in at the Basketball Commission.

5.2. The coach must present a name list of the players (with their numbers), the captain, the team leader and the coaches of the team to the recorder 20 minutes before the competition.

5.3. The coach must sign the sheet to confirm the starting list of the players (with their numbers) at least 10 minutes before the start of the competition.

5.4. The players of the competing teams must wear the uniforms in required colour. The coaches should check the colour before leaving for the venue and report to the scorer's table on their arrival.

6.Athletes and VIP Rooms

6.1. Yang Pu Gymnasium

6.1.1. There are four rest rooms for athletes at the north east side

on the ground floor of the gymnasium with showers and toilets.

6.1.2. VIP lounge will be at the east of the south side on the ground floor.

6.2. Hong Kou Gymnasium

6.2.1. There are four rest rooms for athletes at the north side on the ground floor.

6.2.2. Three VIP rest rooms are located at the south side on the ground floor.

7. Accommodations

All the teams will be accommodated in the Lantian Hotel. Self-service meals will be served in the designated dining-hall on the second floor. Team members have to show their AD cards when entering the restaurant.

The regular meal hours are:

Breakfast 6:00-- 9:00

Lunch 11:00--15:00

Dinner 17:00--23:00

Refreshments and drinks may be obtained between meal hours from the bar on the ground floor with full payment. Free Soft drinks are available at training and competition sites.

8.Transportation

To ensure that the athletes and officials will reach the venue in time for training, competition and watching, the Organizing Committee will provide special transportation for them. For detailed information, please read the Transportation Information.

Vehicles for hire will be available, please refer to the Transportation Information for details.

Transportation for delegations, VIPs, technical delegates, officials and journalists will be provided. Please refer to the Reception Information.

9.Medical Service

There will be 24-hour medical service in the designated hotel. First-aid stations are available in the competition and training sites for medical care and emergency service.

11.Confirmation of Participation

Final entry forms received before 24:00 hours (Beijing time), April 9,1993 shall be taken as the final confirmation of participation.

12. Press

12.1. Areas for journalists will be reserved both in Yang Pu Gymnasium and Hong Kou Gymnasium. All journalists are requested to seat at the designated place. Special passes issued by the Organizing Committee are required for access to the competition area.

12.2. Journalists are requested to contact the Sub-Press Centre in advance if they wish to interview the athletes, coaches or officials. Press conferences will be held 15 minutes after the matches or after the awarding ceremony for finals.

12.3. Flash light is prohibited during the competition.

12.4. Journalists with permission to enter the competition area should stay 2m away from the sideline or the endline of the court to avoid possible interference with the competition.

13. Victory Ceremony

13.1. Victory ceremony will be conducted according to the program worked out by the organizing committee.

13.2. Victory ceremony will be held at a designated area 15 minutes after the final match.

13.3. The first three teams shall wear their uniforms and gather at a designated place to get ready for the victory ceremony.

13.4. Victory ceremony will be announced both in Chinese and English.

13.5. Order of the ceremony

- Playing the fanfare music
- Announcing the beginning of the victory ceremony
- Winners marching in
- Announcement of the competition results
- Presenting medals and flowers
- Flag-raising and anthem playing
- Medalists marching off

14.Doping Control

Doping control tests will be conducted during the 1st East Asian Games' basketball competition in accordance with the regulations laid down by the Medical Committee of the OCA and the International Basketball Federation (FIBA). The methods and number of players to undergo doping test will be agreed upon by the SEAGOG and the Coordination Committee of the East Asian NOCs.

15.Femininity Control

In accordance with the FIBA regulations, femininity control tests will be conducted by the Medical Department and the relevant professional organization with internationally-recognized techniques. Athletes already holding valid femininity certificates issued either by the Medical

Committee of the IOC or international sports federations or the Organizing Committee (or its Medical Committee) of the Continental Games may be exempted from the test.

16. Protests

16.1. Protests and appeal shall be handled according to the FIBA regulations.

16.2. Decisions for protests and appeal will be made by the basketball Jury of Appeal, authorized by the Technical Committee of Asian Basketball Confederation and the Basketball Commission of the 1st East Asian Games. Their decision will be final.

16.3. The Basketball Commission of the 1st East Asian Games will refund the protest deposit if the protest is accepted.

17. Meetings

A technical meeting will be held, on May 9th to be attended by Members of the Technical Committee and the Jury of Appeal, international referees, team leaders and coaches. Matters concerning competition will be announced and discussed at the meeting.

18. Accreditation Cards

Accreditation cards will be issued to the registered athletes and officials upon their arrival for access to the designated hotel, competition and training sites and for using the facilities. Players and officials are requested to carry their AD cards at all times during the Games and show them at the entrance of the hotel, competition or training sites. Loss of AD cards should be reported immediately to the security departments.
