**托福听力考试指南**

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# 前言

托福考试是美国教育考试服务处主办的一种考试, 目的在于考核非英语国家留学生的英语水平。托福考试采用多项选择方法, 考试需三个小时, 其中包括填写表格时间。

考试主要由以下三部份组成:

- (1) 听力——主要是测验考生听懂英语的能力。
- (2) 语法结构与短语——主要是测验考生辨别标准书面英语的能力。
- (3) 阅读理解与词汇——主要是测验考生理解非专业性的阅读材料。

听力考试在整个托福考试中占极高比重，往往是决定考生能否获得高分的关键性因素。为了帮助考生顺利通过托福考试听力部分，我们把历年来托福考试中的听力考试题汇编成册，奉献给读者。

托福听力考试有试题50道，时间共40分钟，听力成绩通常占总分的三分之一。

听力考试题分为三部分:

第一部分有二十题，分为两类问题。一类是回答简短的问话，另一类是了解简短句子的意思。每个问题只说一遍，答案并不写在测验本上，而是做在一张答案纸上，因此，每个人都必须仔细地听。当听到一个问题后，应立即阅读在测验本上的四个答案；并且决定其中哪一个答案是最妥当的回答，然后在答案纸上填答。

### 例 (一)

当听到 “How did you Come to this city?” 时, 应立刻在测验纸上阅读回答这个问题的四个答案:

- (A) By train. (B) To see Mary.  
(C) No, I didn't. (D) Last year.

上面四个答案中唯一正确的是 (A) By train.

### 例 (二)

当听到 “Mary went dancing last night” 时, 在测验本上你可

- (A) Mary Was bust night.  
(B) Mary was sorry tast night.  
(C) Mary went to a dancing party last night.  
(D) Mary saw Dan last night.

这题的正确答案是(C) Mary went to a dancing party last night. 因此应立刻在答案纸(C)格上用铅笔涂满。

第二部分里共有十五题男女问答会话，在会话完毕时，第三者会马上问一简短的问题。当你听完后应阅读在测验纸上的四个答案，然后决定哪一个为正确答案，并立即在答案纸上填上答案。

### 例 (三)

男声: What's the matter, Jean?

女声: I've been to the dentist. I can't go to school today

问: How is Jean?

在测验本上有四个答案:

(A) Jean is happy.

(B) Jean is my sister.

(C) Jean is sick.

(D) Jean wishes to see me.

从会话中, 我们应该选择的正确答案是(C) Jean is sick.

第三部分有十五道题, 约十余分钟的会话及短篇演讲, 其中有电台的天气预报和一般通告等。(考生每听一段会话或短文, 随后便会陆续听到几个问题)在听时应把内容重点记下, 抓住整段内容的中心思想, 对于答不出的问题, 也要根据判断选出答案, 因为托福考试无法对猜对的问题扣分。

总之, 在托福听力考试中, 考生应全神贯注, 仔细倾听, 沉着而不慌乱。如果时间匆促, 也可在答案旁边作上记号以帮助记忆, 最后再作选择。

这本《托福听力考试指南》共收集一千五百多道听力测验题, 共分三大部分。第一部分是听力练习题, 一共有七百六十多道练习题, 里面又分三组, 第一组是听短句, 第二组是听简短的对话, 第三组是听一段短文或会话。其目的在于训练考生对英语口语的理解能力。第二部分是托福听力模拟考题, 一共有十六份模拟考试试卷, 目的在于让考生自行模拟测试, 衡量自己的听理解水平。第三部分是答案及录音文字资料, 提供考生自行对照, 订正答卷。

听力测验在托福考试中占总分百分之三十三, 因此必须特别引起重视。但是, 我国考生普遍感到听力部份最难取得高分, 有的甚至对听力产生畏惧情绪, 因而缺乏应考信心。本书给读者提供了较为集中的托福听力练习, 望读者加强听力训练, 克服困难, 树立信心, 坚持下去, 定能奏效。

这本《托福听力考试指南》配有15盒录音磁带。其中第一部分听力练习题分三组录制, 共七盒磁带; 第二部分听力模拟考题, 一十六份听力试题分别录成八盒磁带, 其中有六份最新托福听力考题是由我系美籍教师吉利安夫妇朗读的。

由于时间仓促, 在编印中一定存在不少缺点和错误, 望广大读者批评指正。

### Section One

#### Part A

In this section of the test, you will have an opportunity to demonstrate your ability to understand spoken English. There are three parts to this section, with special directions for each part.

#### Part A

**Directions:** For each problem in Part A, you will hear a short statement. The statements will be spoken just one time. They will not be written out for you, and you must listen carefully in order to understand what the speaker says when you hear a statement, read the four sentences in your test book and decide which one is closest in meaning to the statement you have heard. Then, on your answer sheet, find the number of the problem and mark your answer.

Example I.

You will hear: John dropped the letter in the mailbox.

Sample Answer

you will read: (A) John sent the letter.

(B) John opened the letter.

(C) John lost the letter.

Sentence(A), "John sent the letter," means most nearly the same as the statement "John dropped the letter in the mailbox." Therefore you should choose answer (A).
