7. 全年最佳體育獎：

該獎係頒與全校全年在田徑、游泳、籃球、排球、足球、羽毛球、乒乓球、舞蹈等八項比賽中表現最佳之班級。本屆最佳體育獎由中一聖奪得。

乙、校外比賽活動

（一）田徑

1. 南區陸運會

香港南區陸運會於八二年十二月十二日在香港仔黃竹坑運動場舉行。本校男子田徑隊共奪得金牌八面、銀牌六面、銅牌四面；女子隊則奪得金牌四面、銀牌七面、銅牌七面，成績斐然。

2. 全港學界田徑錦標賽

由香港學界體育協會主辦之全港學界田徑錦標賽於八三年三月間在灣仔運動場舉行。本校田徑隊員再創佳績，在全港第三組賽事中，男子隊共奪金牌一面、銀牌三面、銅牌三面；女子隊獲得金牌二面、銀牌四面、銅牌五面。其中本校中五公同學譚炳健與中六聖同學葉思聰俱獲選代表香港區出席學界田徑埠際賽，並分別奪得跳高項目銅牌和銀牌。

3. 友校接力邀請賽

在一九八二至八三年度本校男子接力隊共參加五次比賽，共奪得金牌四面、銀牌八面、銅牌八面。

女子接力隊共出賽四次，共奪得金牌八面、銀牌四面、銅牌四面。接力隊全年表現優異，每次出賽，必名列前茅。

（二）游泳

香港南區水運會於八二年十月三日在香港仔游泳池舉行，本校游泳隊共奪金牌四面、銀牌三面、銅牌二面，成績不俗。

（三）排球

本校排球隊再接再勵，繼續努力苦練，本年成績優異。男子排球隊本年度雖與全港第一組一流勁旅作賽，但以前不屈不撓精神，表現出色，乙組男子排球隊苦戰下屈居殿軍，丙組男排則勇奪季軍。在沒派隊參加男子甲組排球賽事情況下，本校男子排球隊在全港第一組排球團體總成績中，排名第四。

女子排球隊成績驕人，在校際比賽中，甲組排球隊僅以些微得失球率差額，屈居亞軍；而乙組排球隊奪得季軍；丙組排球隊則贏得亞軍。在香港區第一組女子組團體成績中，由於表現優異，結果獲得香港區女子總冠軍。

此外，女子排球隊參加南區女子排球比賽，結果囊括比賽亞、季軍。

（四）籃球

本年度本校籃球隊表現亦佳，在校隊賽事中，男子乙組在分組賽中

名列亞軍，男子丙組在分組中亦獲亞軍。

女子乙組在分組賽事中奪得季軍，丙組由於經驗尚淺，於分組賽中祇得殿軍。

(五) 足球

本校足球隊分別參加甲、乙、丙組賽事，甲組在分組賽中獲得第四名，而乙組則奪得季軍，丙組在決賽比賽中勇奪亞軍。由於表現出色，成績優異，最後獲得香港區第三組團體總成績亞軍，明年晉升第二組比賽。

及後，男子丙組足球隊於本年五月間榮獲南區青少年足球賽冠軍，成績璀璨。

丁、暑期活動

在暑假期間，本校亦安排各類型體育活動，以供各同學參加，其中以一年一度全校性之夏令營最為吸引，參加人數共達一百多名。該次夏令營假西貢黃宜洲舉行，日期由八三年七月廿四至廿五日。

在球類活動方面，除舉辦排球、籃球訓練及比賽外，還安排學生參加由教育局和市政局合辦之學生暑期體育訓練計劃，其中有七名本校同學榮獲最佳運動員獎。

戊、其他

除上述所列各項活動外，本校師生更與其他友校師生進行足球、籃球、羽毛球友誼比賽，俾能促進友誼，增進球技。

其他課外活動

(一) 青少年團契

導師及職員為團友每週安排有益靈性及身心之活動。青年團契平均出席人數為四十人左右。豐富的週會內容有靈性造就，如「委身」、「聖經與我」、團契生活實踐，如「生活在社會中的基督徒」、「一九九七」、「戀愛」、「讀書的態度」等等；也有創作性的比賽，如「服裝設計」、「天才表演」等，其他活動包括「夕陽會」燒烤及佈道會。

少年團契團友約五十人經常出席週會，主題環繞「讀經」及「門徒訓練」，另有創作性及娛樂性之活動。

(二) 男童軍

深宵童軍團有定期集會，包括訓練課程，戶內及戶外活動，類如：野外定向、拯溺班、燒烤晚會、烹飪比賽、遠足及一年一度與本校女童軍合辦之聯合露營及訓練營。營期內推出一九九獎章計劃，目的為鼓勵各團員積極參與團內活動，內中分有體能、設計、活動及貢獻四項，考驗團員實力，在本年中，團員皆致力於尊章之考取，其中四名更獲得深宵童軍獎章，營期中修完聽憑派往加拿大，代表香港童軍出席第十五屆全世界童軍大會。

社會服務方面，團員多次出席校內外慶典，參與服務，更舉行集體捐血，為社會作出貢獻。

本年特別興奮之一日係六月四日，本旅深宵團正式成立混合童軍團，歡迎女團員加入，表示本團之發展已踏進新階段，混合團的成立典禮時，得到南區區總監親臨頒發開團證書。

(三) 女童軍

女童軍逢星期五放學後集會，她們均踴躍學藝及參加戶外及戶內活動，包括燒烤、茶會、遠足旅行及戲劇比賽，她們亦於集會時學習各種技能，如現代舞及急救知識等，女童軍亦熱誠地為學校及社團服務。本年女童軍考取多個興趣章，包括烹飪、搜集、款待及藝術。

(四) 公益少年團

公益少年團之目的為使同學有機會為學校和社會作出寶貴貢獻，透過各項課外活動提高學生之公民責任感，鼓勵學生更多瞭解及關懷社會，樂於主動參與社區服務計劃。

今年團員共有一百六十二名，一年中團員曾多次集會討論校內校外之服務事項，為實踐公益少年團之目的，團員曾舉辦多項活動，因得到校方的大力支持，同學反應積極，踴躍參加小童羣益會和寧實醫院等慈善團體之義旗籌款活動，十五位團員被選派出席教育局舉辦之「學生領袖訓練營」；在校內宣傳「清潔香港運動」，又在暑期協助舊書轉讓工作等。

(五) 愛丁堡獎勵計劃

本校愛丁堡獎勵計劃學員參加多項由教育局舉辦之活動。同學完成服務、遠足、興趣、生活設計及宿營技巧各種訓練，並經考核及格，始能獲得獎章。本年共有四位男學員，一位女學員考獲金章，蒙 港督尤德爵士於六月間假座督憲府頒授。同學在暑假期間又參加教育局所辦之各項課程及活動。

(六) 英文學會

今年成立由學生組成之英文學會小組，成員五名均來自高年級，包括有主席、副主席、秘書及三名公關。小組工作係協助推行學會之活動。

中文歌唱比賽，分為合唱組和獨唱組比賽，又分初賽及決賽兩次舉行，初賽在一九八三年三月十一日，於本校禮堂舉行，參

(八) 數學學會

Form Four and Five pupils paid \$600.00 tuition and \$105.00 subscription, and Form Six and Seven pupils paid \$800.00 tuition and \$105.00 subscription per annum. 319 pupils were granted fee remission this year: 31 Full-free Placers, 231 Three-quarters-free Placers and 57 Half-free Placers. In addition, 36 Form Six pupils and 12 Form Seven pupils obtained school scholarships, 10 pupils Local Education Allowance, 17 Government Matriculation Grant, 5 Li Po Chun Charitable Trust Fund Scholarships, 3 Royal Hong Kong Jockey Club Scholarships, 1 Wah Kiu Yat Po Readers' Scholarship and 1 Grantham Scholarship.

(a) *Southern District Sports Meet*

The meeting was held at Wong Chuk Hang Sports Ground on 12th December 1982. Our boys' team won eight gold, six silver, and four bronze medals. The girls' team won four gold, seven silver and seven bronze medals.

(b) *Hong Kong School Sports Association Athletics Championship*

The competitions took place in March at Wanchai Sports Ground. The boys and girls competed in Division Two. The boys' team won one gold, three silver and three bronze medals. The girls' team won two gold, four silver and five bronze medals. In May, Tam Ping Kin of F.S.K and Yip Sze Chung of F.6S represented Hong Kong in the Schools Inter-Port Athletics Championship and won the silver and bronze medals in the high jump events.

(c) *Invitation Relays*

Other Extra-curricular Activities

1. Youth Fellowship Groups

The committees organised various weekly activities for members for their spiritual, mental and physical well-being. The Senior Group was regularly attended by forty members. The rich programme of activities aimed at fostering faith, such as 'life commitment', 'The Bible and I', 'Knowing your church', and the practice of faith in daily life, such as 'A Christian living in the real world', '1997', 'BGR', 'A Christian's attitude of studying'. Other activities like 'Fashion Show', 'Talent Show', BBQ and a Gospel Week were also organised.

The Junior Group had an average attendance of 50. The activities followed the themes 'Knowing God' and 'Being a disciple of the Lord'.

2. Scouts

Venture scouts and scouts met every week, sharing programmes of training and indoor and outdoor activities, such as orienteering and life-saving, and barbecues, cooking contests, hiking and the annual camp held jointly with the girl guides. During the summer vacation, they awarded attendance medals to encourage more active participation by members in four tests of physical ability, designing ability, co-operation and team spirit. As a result of rigid training, four members won the Venture Scout Awards. Tung Wing Chung was fortunate to be chosen to represent Hong Kong in the 15th World Jamboree held in Canada in the summer.

Members gave voluntary service on special school occasions and to regional organisations when they held special functions. They also went as a group to donate blood to the Red Cross.

The highlight of the year was the formal status accorded the Mixed Venture Scout Group (which admitted girls as well as boys to its membership) at a ceremony held on 4th June 1983, when the Group Leader received the certificate of recognition from the Southern District Scout Commissioner.

3. Guides

The guides held their weekly meeting on Friday after school. They organised and took part in several indoor and outdoor activities, such as a tea party, barbecues, hiking and a drama competition. They also learnt new skills and techniques such as modern dance and first-aid. Besides, they gave voluntary service on special school days and other special occasions outside the school. This year, the guides obtained the following interest badges – cook, collector, hostess, artist.

4. Community Youth Club

The aim of the C.Y.C. is to provide students with opportunities to make valuable contribution to the school and the community. Also, it is hoped that by participating in various extra-curricular activities, students will become more aware of their civic responsibilities and will show an active concern towards their community.

There are 162 members of the C.Y.C. this year. The members met regularly throughout the year to discuss service to the school and the community. With the support of the school, students participated in flag-selling, to help raise funds for some charitable organisations, such as the Boys and Girls Clubs Association of Hong Kong and Haven of Hope Hospital. Fifteen members were chosen to take part in the 'Student Leadership Training Programme' arranged by the Education Department in Sai Kung Recreation Centre. Members also helped other pupils in the school to be more aware of the 'Keep Hong Kong Clean Campaign' and assisted at the school's Used-Books Sale in the summer holidays.

5. Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme

The members participated in the various activities organised by the Education Department Operation Authority. To qualify for awards, the members were required to complete their assignments in the Expedition, Interest, Design for living and Residential Sections. Four male members and one female member of the school were awarded gold medals. They received their awards from the Governor, Sir Edward Youde, in Governor's House in June. Members also took part in the E.D.O.A. summer programme.

6. English Society

This year saw the formation of an English committee which consisted of five student members whose duty was to help implement the society's plans for the year; they were a secretary and three public relations officers. They were all upper form students. It was decided at the first meeting to abolish the former weekly meetings after school since those activities could conveniently be organised on an inter-class basis or arranged in remedial classes.

B. **Debating Competition**

An Inter-class debating competition was held from March to May. F4H was the winner. F4H Chung Po Yin was elected the 'Best Debater'. The Society accepted an invitation to take part in the competition organised by St. Peter Secondary School. The result was satisfactory.

C. **The Chinese Bulletin**

The Chinese Bulletin included a brief introduction of the Five Great Mountains in China and with 'Some Amusing Stories about Ancient Chinese Scholars'

In order to create a more enjoyable learning atmosphere, a number of academic and amusing games were also organised; however, the response was rather disappointing.

D. **'Rhythm and Rhyme'**

'Rhythm and Rhyme' was a big talent show and contest which consisted of two parts: Singing in Chinese and New Words for Old Melodies. The contest was further grouped into two sections: solo- and group-singing. There were twelve entries for the solo section and seven for the group-singing section. Four finalists were chosen from each section.

There were thirteen entries for the 'New Words for Old Melodies' part of contest. The winner was Tonny Chung from F.6S.

The Singing Finals held on 18th March 1983 were made even more interesting and enjoyable by items contributed by the teachers and by humorous scenes enacted by pupils. The winners were: solo - Ho Shuk Ching from F.5L, Group - Ho Shuk Ching and Chu Chung Man.

8. *Mathematics Club*

Membership was opened to all students - Form 1 to Form 7. The club was active and ambitious this year. Members took part in the Open Day Exhibition, organized a puzzle every fortnight and arranged remedial classes for pupils weak in mathematics and science subjects. The Annual Mathematics Olympiad took place in July. This year, we invited S.K.H. Tang Shiu Kin Secondary School, Chan Pak Sha School, King's College, T.W.S.H.'s Lee Ching Dea Memorial School and Tang Shiu Kin Victoria Technical School to participate. The clubs also organized competitions to test mathematical knowledge and calculating techniques, and a Mathematics Study Camp and a course in Computer Programming in the summer vacation.

9. *E.P.A. Society*

The Society had an active year. There were regular activities such as a monthly display of newspaper cuttings and a quarterly bulletin. Members paid a visit to the Police Training School. Other activities included an inter-class competition to test knowledge of current affairs. These functions were well-attended.

10. *Geography Society*

The Society took part in the Open Day Exhibition and showed films on volcanic activities, population, fishing and forestry. Model-making and projects were well-supported by members. Other activities included a field trip to Cheung Chau for junior classes and one to Shek O for senior classes, puzzle contests and a quiz for Form one to Form four classes.

11. *History Society*

The following activities were well-attended by members: slide shows, film shows, debates, a project on the Second World War, a Visit to the Fung Ping Shan Museum of the University of Hong Kong and a History Week (with a talk, an exhibition, a Historical Picture Design Competition, slide and film shows on the theme - Great Men in History: Dr. Sun Yat-sen and Gandhi.)

12. *Biology Club*

The Biology Club had 60 enthusiastic members. Group activities included the growing of vegetables, film shows, preserving specimens and the dissection of rats, pig's hearts, ox-eyes and grasshoppers. Field trips to study the ecology of mangrove swamp were also organised. Moreover, a brief study of some physiological aspects of the common water fleas was carried out.
