

# 修订版前言

普通高等教育"十五"国家级规划教材《新世纪高职高专英语》(综合教程)于 2000 年正式出版发行。由于该套教材充分利用国内外英语教学科研成果,全面体现高职高 专英语教学规律,突出"五项创新",深受广大师生欢迎。为了使这套教材更加完善,上 海外语教育出版社组织我国四所高职名校,深圳职业技术学院、上海第二工业大学、北 京联合大学和华东师范大学职业技术学院的英语骨干教师对教材进行了全面修订。我 们利用调查表和座谈会的形式,广泛征求用户和专家的意见和建议,并按照教育部高等 教育司颁布的《高职高专教育英语课程教学基本要求》,结合高职高专英语教学实际,在 保留原有特色的基础上,对原教材做了较大幅度的改进和扩充。

本套《练习与测试》为配合《综合教程》(修订版)和高等学校英语应用能力考试(A、B级)而设计,共分十个单元。和初版的《练习册》相比起来,形式与内容有较大的调整和扩充,突出体现了巩固教学内容与训练学生应考能力并行不悖的双重功能,所以改名为《练习与测试》。每单元内容分为两个部分,第一部分(PART I)保留了初版练习册中以消化和巩固课堂教学内容为主的编排形式,如词汇填空,重点结构操练,介词和副词填空等项目。第二部分(PART II)是新编写的内容,为帮助学生准备参加 PET 考试而设计,即现在通称的 PRETCO(Practical English Test for Colleges)考试。所有题型和题量的设计均以A、B级考试大纲和样题为依据。这部分设置为两个台阶。第一台阶(Step 1)以判断题为主,突出对基本词汇与结构的训练;第二台阶(Step 2)的题型主要是主观题的形式,加强培养学生的英语综合技能及实用能力。最后还增加了高等学校英语应用能力考试(PRETCO)A级和B级两套全真试卷供学生自测。所以修订版的《练习与测试》既能帮助学生巩固课堂所学内容,又为他们提供充分的应考材料和操练机会,使他们能够在训练有素的基础上积极应对全国 PRETCO 考试。教师可以根据学生的英语程度以及教学实际情况选择使用。书末附有第一部分和第二部分的参考答案。

Numerous studies have shown that high-risk investors make more profits than low-risk ones. Over time the stock market rewards them for sticking their necks out, and sometimes getting them chopped off.

The classic high-risk investment is in shares in a small company which is perhaps newly listed on the stock exchange. Such a small company price might go up.

But, even those classic low-risk investments carry the risk that interest rates will rise and your money will be tied up at the lower interest rates at which you first invested.

This tells: high risk equals high return. If you want to maximize your savings, take some risk with at least some of your money.

Keep in mind: diversify(作多种投资), or spread your eggs into lots of baskets. This is partly so you won't be hurt too badly if one company falls over.
