## 前 言

## 编写背景

本教材是为了配合内蒙古农业大学教学改革项目而编写的一本视听说教材。目前,大多数高校的公共外语课程的设置还是以传统的精读课程为主,在教学过程中受课时、教学设备、教学材料等多方面的限制,教师主要是以语言的输入为主,学生的语言交际能力没有得到最大限度的开发,大多数学生学到的还是"哑巴英语"或者"应试英语"。随着大学英语教学改革的不断扩展和深化,大学英语教学的教学要求、课程设置、教学评估和教学管理都面临着新的变革。本教材集朗读、视听、说练、表演于一体,是一本既重视语言的输入,又突出语言的产出能力培养的拓展教材,而语言的输入与产出的结合正是大学英语教学改革目标的核心内容和精髓所在。

## 编写原则

本教材在编写过程中力图将电影这种真实、生动、地道的语言材料与传统英语教学方法的精髓结合起来,既避免教学陷入枯燥无味、被动学习、学习效果差的传统英语教学模式,又防止一味追求兴趣教学、不求甚解,从而使教学流于形式。因此,无论是影片的选取,还是题型的设计,都是经过反复斟酌和考虑的结果。

## 选材特点

## 教材特点

### **尹** 理念合理化

本教材在整体设计过程中充分体现了"以学生为主体、教师为指导"的教学理念,这一理念新颖时尚,且符合教学规律,十分合理。从课前的开放式讨论,到课程进行中的各类习题的解答,再到影片赏析后的配音、角色扮演等活动,所有题型的设计都是以学生为主,要求学生尽最大可能地发挥其主体作用,参与到教学的各个环节中。

#### III. Culture Notes

#### 1. AP(Advanced Placement)

The Advanced Placement Program, administered by The College Board and taught at local high schools, is a three-year sequence of course work in 22 subject areas and allows students to participate in a college level course and possibly earn college credit while still in high school. Secondary schools and colleges cooperate in this program to give students the opportunity to show mastery in college-level courses by taking the AP exam in May of each school year. The reason most prep schools offer AP courses is that a good grade in an AP exam usually eliminates the need to take the equivalent first year college course. That means students can get on with more advanced courses as soon as they start college.

#### 2. Rumi

Molana Jalāluddin Rumi who is known to the English-speaking world simply as Rumi (30 September, 1207—17 December, 1273) was a 13th-century Persian Muslim poet, jurist, theologian, and Sufi mystic. He was born in Balkh Province in Afghanistan and died in 1273 AD in Konya. Rumi's works are written in the New Persian language. His poems have been widely translated into many of the world's languages and transposed into various formats. In 2007, he was described as the "most popular poet in America."

#### 3. Garry Marshall

Garry Kent Marshall, the Emmy-nominated writer, director and producer, was born in New York City, NY on Nov. 13, 1934, who is the guiding force behind some of the most popular films and television shows of the late 20th century.

Garry Marshall rose from the writers' room on series like "The Dick Van Dyke Show" (CBS, 1961—1966) to producer and creator of such enduring hits as "The Odd Couple" (ABC, 1970—1975), "Happy Days" (ABC, 1974—1984), "Laverne and Shirley" (ABC, 1976—1983) and "Mork and Mindy" (ABC, 1978—1982).

Marshall's segue into film direction during the early 1980s was equally successful and would go on to include such box office juggernauts as "Pretty Woman" (1990) and the "The Princess Diaries" (2001) franchise. His film career rallied in 2001 with "The Princess Diaries," which gave Marshall his first major hit in over a decade (the inevitable sequel, 2004's "The Princess Diaries 2: Royal Engagement, "fared only slightly less successfully at the box office).
