






## 前 言

祝贺你! 在你拿起本书的时候, 你已经迈出了获得 SAT 高分的第一步。

在准备的时候,要记住 SAT 考试只测试你在 SAT 中的表现如何,其他什么也代表不了。

- 1. SAT 不测试的内容。SAT 既不测试智力水平也不衡量学生高中学习的深度和广度。它不像你的高中成绩那样,可以预测你的大学成绩。很多大学也对是否使用 25 分钟写作成绩作为录取的一个因素犹疑不定。招生官员们知道,能够评判你个人表现的不仅仅是在某一个周六早晨一场四个小时的考试。
- 2. SAT 往往会低估女性、少数民族和弱势学生将来在大学里的表现。以前,女生的 SAT 成绩通常比男生要差,但她们在大学里的表现却更优秀。对于一个用来预测学生在未来大学里表现的考试,这真是一个可悲的事实。

当然,这并不意味着你不应该参加 SAT。虽然几乎每一个学校都接受 ACT 考试成绩(另一种人学考试),而且一些文理学院(Liberal Arts Schools)不硬性要求 SAT 成绩,但是那些竞争激烈的学校仍然是需要 SAT 成绩的。对于 SAT 的缺陷,你要采取的态度是:不要在意最后的分数如何,只管你是否在考试时发挥正常,这就足够了。

让我们抓紧时间开始学习本书吧。在此之前,你最好查一下梦想的学校所要求的分数,然后在 此基础上制定目标计划并为之努力。预祝广大考生在 SAT 和大学申请中一切顺利。





# Chapter 1 SAT Basics

#### **How Is the SAT Scored?**

Your Math, Critical Reading, and Writing scores are available online at the College Board's website or by phone about two and a half weeks after you take the real SAT. Four weeks after you take the SAT, you'll receive in the mail a report containing your scores. Each score is reported on a scale from 200 to 800; the average student scores around 500 in each subject area. Scores go up or down in increments of ten points.

The total maximum score for the SAT is 2,400 points. You'll also hear about two other kinds of scores in connection with the SAT and other standardized tests: raw scores and percentile scores.

Your raw score is simply the number of questions you answered correctly minus a fraction of the number of questions you answered incorrectly; it's used to calculate your final scaled score (from 200 to 800). A percentile score is how you did in relation to everyone else who took the test. If your score is in the 60th percentile, it means you did better on the test than 60 percent of the people who took it. Percentile varies from year to year and from test to test. For example, a 550 might put you in the 65th percentile one year, but the 55th percentile the next year.

#### Where Does the SAT Come From?

The SAT is published by Educational Testing Service (ETS). ETS is a large company that sells not only the SAT, but also about 500 other tests, including ones for CIA agents, golf pros, travel agents, firefighters, and barbers. ETS is located outside of Princeton, New Jersey, on a beautiful 400-acre estate that used to be a hunting club. The buildings where the SAT is written are surrounded by woods and hills. There is a swimming pool, a goose pond, a baseball diamond, lighted tennis courts, jogging trails, an expensive house for the company's president, and a private hotel where rooms cost more than \$200 a night.

You may have been told that ETS is a government agency or that it's part of Princeton University. It is neither. ETS is just a private company that makes a lot of money writing and selling tests. The organization that hires ETS to write the SAT is called the College Entrance Examination Board or the College Board.

#### What Does the SAT Measure?

If you are like many high school students, you think of the SAT as a test of how smart you are. If you score 800 on the Critical Reading section, you probably think of yourself as a genius. If you score 200, you probably think of yourself as an idiot. You may even think of an SAT score as a permanent label, like your Social Security number. ETS encourages you to think this way by telling you that the test measures your ability to reason and by claiming that you cannot significantly improve your score through special preparation (a strange claim from a company that sells its own preparation materials!).

Nothing could be further from the truth. The SAT isn't a test of how smart you are; more than anything else, it's a test of how good you are at taking the SAT.

Can you learn to be better at taking the SAT? Of course you can. That's what this book is all about. You can improve your SAT score in exactly the same way you would improve your grade in chemistry: by learning the material you are going to be tested on and familiarizing yourself with the test format. Let's get to know the test.


#### Score Choice!

This is maybe the one nice thing that ETS has ever done for you. Don't let it go to your head, though, they are doing it to compete with the ACT which has always given students this privilege.


As of March 2009, you can now choose which SAT (by test date) and which SAT Subject Scores (by individual test) you want to sent on to colleges. Previously, colleges would see your whole record. Now they just see what they need to (i.e., your best score). Score Choice is optional and you have to specify by checking a box that you'd like to use it. If you don't check the box, all your scores will be sent automatically.

## **How Important Are SAT Scores?**

The SAT is an important factor when you apply to colleges, but it is not the only factor. A rule of thumb: The larger the college, the more important the SAT score. Small liberal arts colleges will heavily weigh your extracurricular activities, interview, essays, and recommendations. Large state universities, however, often admit students based on formulas consisting mostly of just two ingredients: test scores and grade-point averages.

Even at a small liberal arts college, however, SAT scores can be a deciding factor. If your scores fall below a school's usual range, admissions officers will look very critically at other elements in your application. For most college applicants, their SAT scores are the equivalent of a first impression. If your scores are good, an admissions officer will be more likely to give you the benefit of the doubt in other areas.

## **How Important Are the Writing Scores?**

Colleges and universities are still working on how best to utilize the Writing score on the SAT. The Math and Critical Reading scores are both familiar to colleges and comparable with the older test's scores, but the Writing score is obviously less familiar. Many schools are using the Writing score for placement purposes, but other schools aren't quite sure what to do with it. So for the time being, expect to see a decent amount of variation in how colleges treat the SAT Writing score.

The best approach to the Writing portions of the test is to do your best, just as you do on the other portions. Don't worry about how colleges may or may not use this score. They may not even be sure themselves. If you want to know how a college to which you are applying will use the Writing score, contact the admissions office of that college directly, or refer to the college's website for more details.



#### WHAT IS THE BEST WAY TO PREPARE FOR THE SAT?

First off, take your time. Do not try to prep in the week before the test. Ideally, you should spread the work out over a month or two. Second, give it some effort. The SAT is important and requires you to spend at least 40 hours getting ready. Taking just four practice tests will use up a third of that time; you should spend the rest reviewing the basic skills tested by the questions you're getting wrong and practicing your pacing and test-taking skills.

Should you take a course or get a tutor? It depends on the gains you're looking for. A good course or tutor should enable you to raise your scores by 200 points or more. However, if your scores are pretty good to begin with, or if you work very well on your own, you're probably fine with a book.
