

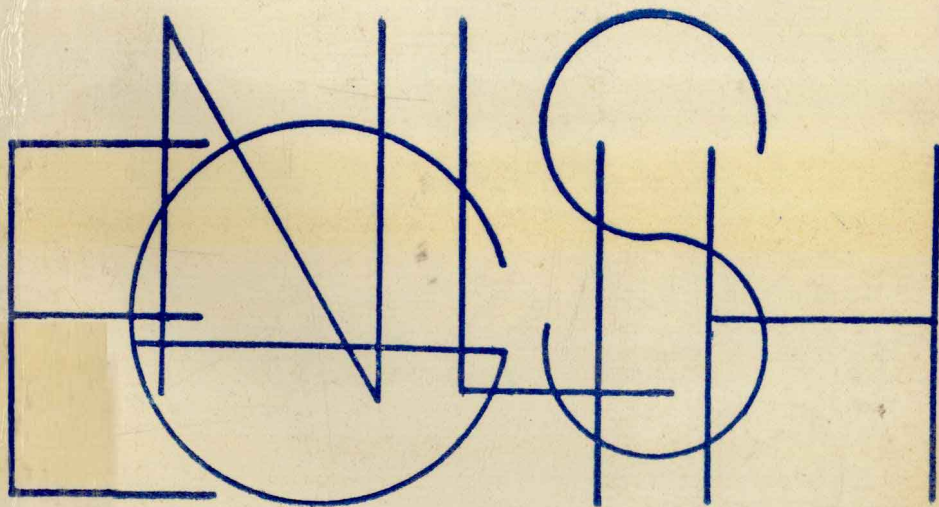

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# 前 言

《大学英语教学大纲》明确提出了分级教学的要求,并对各级的词汇、语法结构、功能意念以及语言技能都作了具体的规定。听说读写四项基本技能是互相联系、相辅相成的,它们拥有一个共同的基础——词汇和语法。如果学生词汇贫乏语法基础薄弱,那么他对老师所传授的阅读技巧、写作方法就会难以接受,听和说更是无从谈起。英语水平的提高有赖于词汇语法这个基础。根据这一思想,我们在大学英语教学中专门开设了词汇语法课,把它与听说、阅读、写作并列为大学英语的四门基本课程。

本书是在使用了几年的词汇语法讲义的基础上整编而成的。是我校大学英语系列教材之一。本教程有以下特点:

一、供大学英语三四级使用,需用 40 学时,平均每学时做 50 道习题。

二、词汇(包括各类短语)和语法的比例大致为 4.5:5.5。

三、每个专项语法练习之前均有语法要点综述。重点突出、简明扼要,便于贯彻精讲多练的教学原则。

四、语法中的重点和难点项目的习题数量都在 100 题以上,不太重要、易于掌握的语法项目的习题都在 50 题左右。

五、书后有答案,以供参考。

本书由郁祖贤、缪君强、吴让科合作编写。分工如下:第一章、第九章和第十四章由缪君强编写;第二章、第七章和第十章由吴让科编写,其余各章由郁祖贤编写。

在编写过程中,我们参考了国内外出版的多种语法专著,

报刊杂志和试题集。对有关作者特表示衷心感谢。限于篇幅,恕不能在此一一列举。

由于编者水平和经验有限,错讹之处,在所难免。望广大读者特别是同行批评指正。

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# 第一章 时 态

在时态学习中,我们应注意掌握以下几种时态之间的区别:

## 一、现在完成时和一般过去时的区别

现在完成时和一般过去时都表示过去发生的动作和情况。一般过去时强调动作发生在过去;现在完成时强调动作持续到现在或强调该动作对现状的影响。例如:

(1) "I have seen the film."

"When did you see it?"

"I saw it last week."

(2) I've learnt most of the irregular verbs since we last met.

一般过去时常用过去时间状语,如 five minutes ago, yesterday, the other day, last month, in 1988, when, we were young 等。

现在完成时常用 since, for, lately, so far, till now, up to the present, already, just 等。这两种时态都可用包括现在时间在内的状语,如 this morning, this year, today 等;也可用不明确时间的 ever 和 never 等。

## 二、现在完成时和现在完成进行时的区别

现在完成时和现在完成进行时都表示动作从过去某时开始一直持续到现在。现在完成时强调动作的重复或动作的完

成, 现在完成进行时强调动作的延续性, 强调动作在这段时间里一直在进行, 该动作可能刚刚停止, 也可能仍在进行。例如:

(1) I have been learning Japanese since we last met and have made some progress.

(2) Professor Allen has taught in many foreign countries.

(3) Professor Bush has been teaching foreign students for about six years.

(4) It has rained every day this week.

(5) It has been raining all morning.

现在完成进行时态一般要与表示一段时间的状语连用。

### 三、一般将来时与将来进行时的区别

一般将来时与将来进行时都表示将来要发生的动作。一般将来时表示说话人的意图, 带有情态色彩, 将来进行时表示预料将要发生的(按正常情况一定会发生的)事情。例如:

(1) I'll make a point of seeing him about it tomorrow.

(2) Don't worry. I'll be seeing him tomorrow. Then I can tell him about it.

将来进行时在现代英语口语中用得比较多。正因为将来进行时不带情态色彩, 从而在某些场合便能表示婉转口气, 以表达有礼貌的询问、请求。例如:

(1) Will you be mentioning me in your report?

(2) When will you be visiting us?
