### 出版前言








When Grandpa was a kid, he was good at sport. He got lots of prizes for all kinds of things.

When he got older, he started playing golf (打高尔夫球). He also got lots of prizes for golf.








After a while,

## Helping Out


Grandpa loved being in his garden. He liked to hear the radio when he worked.
