

# 前 言

为了帮助考生在重点专题上有更大的突破,从容应对高考,我们组织了很多经验丰富的高三一线名师精心编写了《高考英语必备——完形填空》。该书结合高考一线教师和考生的实际需要,对考生进行完形填空试题解题方法的指导。本书具有以下特点:

- 1. 科学性。本丛书对最新高考真题进行科学分析,认真总结高考完形填空试题的命题规律,并由名家权威预测下一年命题趋势。试题严格按照高考命题特点命制并全部由名校特高级教师审核,形成质量高、数量精的高考实战训练体系。

# 第一章。高考英语完形填空综述

## 一、高考完形填空命题特点

# 1. 能力特点

完形填空题一直是高考英语试题中一个重要的综合性语言测试题型。按照考试大纲中对完形填空的能力要求和说明,完形填空考查学生综合运用英语知识的能力,试题突出语篇、注重语境、强调应用,即考查学生根据上下文语境、词汇基础知识、生活常识、文化背景进行分析、区别、判断的能力。纵观近几年试题,我们发现试题中需要通过上下文进行考虑的题目约占60%~70%,其中需要从全文角度考虑的占1/4以上。

#### 2. 选材特点

完形填空题材广泛,它涉及日常生活、文史知识、科技小品、政治、经济、人物、社会、故事等,体裁多选用夹叙夹议的叙述文体。

完形填空的试题考查对象主要为动词、名词、形容词、副词等实词,虚词等较少涉及。所考查的单词都是一些考纲中要求的常见、常用的基础词汇,几乎没有生、偏、怪、难的词汇和短语。语法题和同义词辨析题较少见或没有。

## 二、高考完形填空命题趋势

- (2) 短文内容逻辑性强,结构严谨,层次分明。
- (3)语言特点符合高中学生的认知水平,一般还会采用记叙文体,尽量避免洗用专业性 太强的说明或论说文体。
- (4) 新的一年的高考完形填空试题的命制仍然以"突出语篇,强调语境"为主,强调根据 语境进行选择,其中大多数是单词填空,词组和短语填空有但不是太多。

完形填空的第一个句子通常是完整的,不设置空白,而第一句往往是文章的主题句 (Topic Sentence),明确指示段落的内容,起到限定主题范围的作用,考生可以根据它来把握 文章的中心思想,为下面答题奠定基础。根据完形填空主题句的特点,我们在阅读完形填空 文章的第一句话时,就透过首句来预测文章的中心内容,为以后的做题指引方向。

### 3. 瞻前顾后 先易后难

完形填空的文章是一个意义相联的语篇,它围绕一个话题论述,在行文中词语重复、词 语替代现象都很常见。或者还会出现词语和意义相互解释的现象,所以我们在解题时应"瞻 前顾后",联系上下文寻找相关线索。大家会发现有时可以通过上下文语境就可以找出需要 猜测单词的词义或解释,有时甚至原文中的短语或单词就是答案。先易后难指的是先解决 有把握的空格,没有把握的选项就空着,不可主观臆断,可先临时选上一个充数,然后再根据 已经选择出来的其他空格进行判断,推理出正确答案。

#### 4. 重读文章 核对解疑


首次的阅读和解题是一气呵成的,所以选择过后还应重读文章,根据上下文对把握不准的答案进行推敲判断,从语义和逻辑的角度检查文章是否有问题,答案是否正确。复读全文并不是简单意义上的重复阅读,而是要检查文章大意和逻辑前后是否贯通,内容是否矛盾,从各个角度仔细权衡,以便弥补疏漏。
