近年来,使用英语进行交际的场合日益增多,英语的教学任务日益繁重,这使得英语听力水平的提高日益成为广大英语学习者的迫切要求。

本教材的编写旨在培养学习者英语基本听力能力。强调听力基本功训练和基本技能的培养。在内容上力求新颖、有趣,使学习者能轻松愉快地接受各种听力任务,提高训练的效果。

本书共十二个单元、每一单元分为四或五部分。

第一部分为基本能力培养。练习形式多样,有简短对话、填空练习、听写练习、 辨音练习,图表信息转换练习等。内容的覆盖面广,着重介绍民俗风情,文化背景等。包括问候、介绍、购物、乘车、求助、打电话等常见的生活题材。紧密联系生活,实用性强。

第二、三部分为基础训练,针对学生听力的薄弱环节,培养学生听懂一些小短文和简短对话的能力,培养学生对听力材料进行分析、归纳、综合的能力。这两部分练习多为选择项,以使学生适应各种听力考试的形式。

第四部分为口语练习。本书坚持先听后说的原则。强调听说结合的学习方法。致力于培养学生的口头交际习惯。口语练习总是围绕着一个主题,有指导地组织学生进行口语训练,使学习者的听说能力得到提高。

本书在最后还编写有测试练习以供学生自测。

由于编者的水平有限,加之时间仓促,难免有不妥之处,敬请专家和读者予以指正。
