前 言

大学英语四级考试(CET-4)是国家教委为全面考核已修完大学英语四级的学生是否达到教学大纲所确定的各项目标而组织进行的统一的标准化测试。CET-4自主办以来,对于检测学生运用英语的能力、提高教学水平,均起到了积极的作用。

词汇及语法结构部分(Vocabulary and Structure)在 CET - 4 中共为 30 题,一般要求考生 20 分钟内完成。题目中词和短语的用法占 40%,语法结构占 60%。其目的在于测试学生运用词汇、短语及语法结构的能力。考试范围包括教学大纲词汇表及语法结构表 1 至 4 级的全部内容。

词汇和语法结构是学生的强项,一般的学生此部分都能做对一半以上。然而绝大多数的学生都在不同程度上对听力、阅读理解或作文感到畏惧,需要在词汇和语法结构部分获得高分来弥补其不足。因此要想通过四级考试或者获得四级考试的高分,考生的目标应该是:词汇和语法结构绝对满分!

本书精心准备的 40 套词汇及语法结构试题,内容涵盖教学大纲,其中不乏历年四级考试中的优秀试题。每道题都配有解题焦点,详细地解释了题目的特点及解题技巧。

本书由马骍、马玉杰、徐瑛主编。桑军、王惟一、王子旭、索兰、徐孟扬、庄巧等同志亦参加了本书的编写工作。由于作者水平有限,错漏在所难免,欢迎读者批评指正。

为便于学生及老师使用,本书采用活页装订。希望本书为帮助考生通过四级考试起到积极的 作用。
