

前言

随着改革开放的不断深入和我国国力的逐步增强,我国与国外的交往越来越频繁,随之而来的是对英语听说能力的要求越来越高。在加入WTO这个世界贸易大家庭后,对英语听说能力的要求也进一步提高。《大学英语泛听》旨在通过广泛的选材和多样的练习帮助英语学习者提高听说能力。

《大学英语泛听》力求体现一个"泛"字。一是选材"泛",涉及日常生活、社会习俗、体育、教育、择业、历史、文化、艺术、经济、法律、最新科技等方方面面。二是内容形式"泛",包括简短对话、情景对话、短文、幽默故事以及各种形式的练习。三是适用范围"泛",可用于课堂教学,也可作为课堂教学的补充材料,创造英语学习环境,活跃英语学习气氛。《大学英语泛听》适用于非英语专业大学生,同时也适用于英语专业低年级大学生、涉外机构工作人员、三资企业雇员和其他英语自学者。

《大学英语泛听》力求集知识性、趣味性、时代性、可听性和可模仿性于一体。

- 1. 知识性:每一单元围绕一个主题展开,包含相关知识的介绍,内容涉及从日常 生活到最新科技等方方面面。
- 2. 趣味性:在内容、语言、版式和插图等方面都力求趣味性,每一单元都附有小幽默或小故事,寓教于乐。
- 3. 时代性:在选材上注意选择了不少体现时代气息的主题,同时在语言上也力求贴近时代发展的特点。
- 4. 可听性:考虑到听的特殊要求,在词汇数量和难度、句子长度和难度以及总体语言难度上都作了适当控制,同时,各册和每册各单元的编排上都考虑到了难度和梯度。
- 5. 可模仿性:力求体现现代英语教学的相关理论和方法,通过大量的、真实实用的语言输入,给学习者提供良好的模仿机会,并为学习者用英语表达自己的思想打好坚实的基础。

《大学英语泛听》的录音由外国专家和专业技术人员共同录制,语音纯正、地道、清晰。

本册各单元编者分别为:季月(1、2、3、4、12),沈传海(5、7);高圣兵(6、11);刘成(8);肖飞(9);沙凯(10)。


