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再版前言

本书自 1994 年出版 5 年以来受到了广大读者的欢迎。今年国家考试中心公布了大学英语四、六级考试新题型后,我们参照新题型所增加的内容和要求对本书进行了修订。

本书共分七个部分。第一部分为听力理解,由十个单元组成,每个单元有 十篇对话,三篇短文,20 道测试题。所选材料内容丰富,语言流畅,并请外籍专 家录制磁带三盘。第二部分为阅读理解。这一测试项目是考试的重要部分,又 是学生的薄弱环节。因此,我们在编写过程中,突出了数量多,难度大的特点。 每一单元由四至七篇短文组成,十个单元共有300道测试题。此次修订删除了 部分段落,增加了一些语言新、内容好、难度大的段落。第三部分为词汇结构。 我们精心编写了450道试题,分为十个单元。题中约60%为词汇和短语.约 40%为语法结构,词汇部分覆盖了词表中大部分六级词汇,结构部分体现了一定 的难度。此次修订删除了不少结构题,增加了大量的六级词汇题,使这部分与 目前六级考题的词汇部分非常贴近。第四部分为改错,共有20篇短文。我们挑 选了难度适中,题材熟悉的文章,合理设计错误供学生练习。第七部分为写作, 此次修订又增加5个作文题,共25个作文题,其中包括各种文体的写作。我们 编写了各种作文题目,有段落写作,也有整篇文章写作,题材新颖,思路开阔,而 且对每一个作文题都写出了范文,供学生学习模仿。另外,此次修订还增加了 第五部分简答题和第六部分完形填空两个题型,把四、六级的题型打通,切实帮 助学生适应各种题型,从而提高应试能力。

为了使读者对六级考试有一个全面具体的了解,在附录中,我们收集了国家教委的"大学英语六级考试大纲及样题"。

本书的第一部分听力理解由张俊芝编写,第二部分阅读理解,第五部分简答题和第六部分简答题由薛琛编写,第三部分词汇结构由索金梅编写,第四部分改错和第七部分写作由董红梅编写。全书由薛琛统稿。

本书在编写过程中得到南开大学公共外语教学部和研究生院的大力支持,在此我们表示衷心的感谢。

由于时间仓促,水平有限,凡错误与疏漏之处,恳请读者批评指正。
