前 言

当今高等职业教育的改革非常重视学生创新能力和实际工作能力的培养,而制约高职高专英语教学质量和学生英语水平提高的一个至关重要的因素就是教学方法改革滞后,可以说,如果不能从根本上改进教学方法,提高高职高专英语教学质量和学生英语水平就很难有指望。把知识、能力、素质协调发展、综合培养作为高职高专英语教学目的,必然要求相应的教学方法与之相适应,因此优化教学方法是目前高职高专英语教学改革的重点之一。高职高专英语教学重在对学生的品格、思维、语言能力、健全人格、文化意识等全面的培养,以利于学生的终身学习和发展。所以除语言知识、语言技能外,应该把情感态度、学习策略、文化意识列为教学目的,以学生的发展为本,尊重学生的个性差异。这正是高职高专英语教学改革的新意和价值所在。

《新编新时代大学英语》系列教材依照教育部《高等职业教育英语课程教学要求(试行)》,本着以就业为导向、实用为主、够用为度、全面提升英语应用能力的原则进行设计、编写,根据高职教学的实际需要,突出语言运用训练、职场交际与沟通能力。

该系列教材打破传统教材编写模式,结合一线教学实践,融入全新的教育理念和科学的教学方法,尤其在实用性、适度性、趣味性和时代性等几个方面体现出鲜明的特色。一是突出实用性。教材内容贴近实际,以学生的日常生活和职场交际为着眼点,使学生在循序渐进的听、说、读、写、译等训练中提升语言的应用能力,真正做到学以致用。二是突出适度性。教材打破传统的单一结构性的束缚,依据学生的接受能力和实际需求选取学习内容,层次分明,难易适度,能够满足不同基础学生的学习需要。三是突出趣味性。教材板块设计灵活、多样:情景设置易于操作,有助于学习兴趣的提高,使学生主动参与到课堂的学习当中,建立互动的教学模式。四是突出时代性。教材所选文章内容紧扣时代脉搏,涵盖当前社会热点、重大事件和流行话题等诸多方面,能够使学生在熟悉的背景之下进行英语学习,激发学习热情,提升学习效果。

因此,我建议教师在使用该系列教材中,强调学生个体差异性,因材施教;突出实践性,培养学生的口语及听说能力;重视开发性,挖掘学生的内在潜力,不断地提高学生的英语水平。作为教师,要加强自身素质及修养,充分挖掘和发挥学生的潜能,调动学生的学习积极性,使学生在英语教学中的主体作用得到淋漓尽致的发挥。这样才能使学生完成从语言学习到语言应用这一质的飞跃,才能造就出真正为社会所认可所需求的实用型人才。

Peking University Library was founded in 1902 under the name Capital University Bool Collection Building. After the revolution (革命) of 1911, it gained its present name. Around th May 4th Movement of 1919, Peking University became one of the centers for revolutionar activities. Some of the revolutionary leaders, such as Li Dazhao and Mao Zedong, worked in th library. Many well-known scholars(学者), including Zhang Shizhao, Yuan Tongli and Xiang Dahad been library directors. In 1952, after the nationwide readjustment(重新调整) of colleges an universities, the library moved with Peking University to the former Yenching University (燕京大学) campus, and the Yenching University Library was incorporated (纳入) into the Pekin University Library. Peking University library also obtained collections from other universities and it finally formed the present collection centered in the former Yenching University Librar building. In 1975, a new library building was founded in the center of the campus. At that time,

was the best library with the greatest building area and the best building conditions in China. On May 4th 1998, the centennial anniversary of Peking University, the new library building was constructed, symbolizing(象征) the new beginning of the library's march towards modernization. The well-known Hong Kong entrepreneur, Honorary Doctor of Peking University, Mr. Li Ka Shing financially sponsored the construction.
