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

社会的发展离不开发达的科学技术支撑下的经济繁荣,同样离不开人文社会科学的发展,因此在此前提下的社会发展是一种多元化的发展,社会发展的成果是一种多元化发展的结果。"人类的文明,社会的进步,个人的修养,每时每刻都离不开文学,文学既是人类文明的产物,又反过来促进人类文明。这也正是为什么人类社会经历了几千年风雨,中间无论怎样改朝换代,文学始终没有泯灭的道理。"《留住精彩——世界名著精选精读》多少可以引导读者接近文学,这也正是我们当今社会所特别需要的,我为她的出版呐喊助威!



## The Scarlet Letter

红 字

Nathanial Hawthorne





A Brief Introduction to the Author





### Family Background 家庭背景

Nathanial Hawthorne (1804–1864) is one of the most significant writers of the Romantic Period in America of the 19th century. He was born as Nathaniel Hathorne on July 4, 1804, in Salem, Massachusetts. Hawthorne was the descent of a long line of Puritan ancestors, and the social and economic status of his family was declining at his birth. Hawthorne's ancestor, William Hathorne, was one of the first settlers from England in 1630 and soon became one of the community's leaders, and he was merciless in his persecution of Quakers. Hawthorne mentioned it in the preface of The Scarlet Letter. John Hathorne, the son of William, was one of the judges who oversaw the notorious Salem Witch Trials in 1692. It was said John Hathorne was cursed by the husband of a witch and the family declined from then on.

Hawthorne's father, who was a captain, died on a voyage in Surinam Dutch Guinea when he was only 4 years of age. Young Nathaniel, his mother and two sisters moved to maternal grandfather's in Salem. From that time on, his widowed mother became overly protective and seldom left her own room, and his two sisters also kept silent all the time. Because of the misdeeds of his Puritan ancestors as well as the solemn atmosphere in the family, Hawthorne lived in solitude and seclusion. He believed that the downfall of his family just resulted from retribution. In order to differentiate himself from his notorious Puritan ancestors and get rid of the evil curse, Hawthorne added the letter W in his name shortly after his graduation from Bowdoin College in 1825. However, the memory of his family and its influence accompanied with Hawthorne all the time, and the guilty consciousness haunted around him, for which Hawthorne showed his idea of redemption in a lot of his works.

纳撒尼尔·霍桑 (1804-1864) 是 19 世纪浪漫主义文学时期美国最重要 的作家之一。1804年7月4日,霍桑出生于马塞诸塞州塞勒姆镇一个具有清

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
教传统的世家,但他出世时家族已逐渐没落。霍桑的先祖威廉·哈桑(William Hathorne)是 1630 年首批英国移民之一,后来成为当地的行政长官,曾经残忍地迫害过教友会教徒。霍桑在其著作《红字》的序言中曾提到过此事。霍桑的另一位先祖,约翰·哈桑(John Hathorne)是 1692 年臭名昭著的"萨勒姆驱巫案"中的一位法官。据说约翰·哈桑受到了其中一个女巫丈夫的诅咒,家庭从此逐渐衰落。

霍桑的父亲是一名船长,在他 4 岁时死于南美的苏里南航行途中,于是年幼的霍桑和他的两个姐妹随母亲投靠萨莱姆镇上的外祖父。自那时起他的寡母性格发生了很大的变化,她很少离开自己的房间,姐妹们也是寡言少语。由于家族历史和家庭氛围的双重影响,霍桑性格内向,喜欢独处。他深信自己家族后来的没落是罪有应得,为了将自己与祖先区别开来,摆脱先祖恶迹的诅咒,霍桑在 1825 年从波多因学院毕业后不久便将家姓由哈桑改为霍桑。可事实上,家族记忆似胎记烙印在他身上,永难抹去,人生罪恶感似乎一生都萦绕于他的心头,因而在他的许多作品中都带有为其祖先赎罪的想法。

## Education and Career 教育与经历

The maternal relatives recognized his literary talent and in 1821 financed his education at Bowdoin College. Among his classmates were many of the important literary and political figures of the day, including the later elected president Franklin Pierce and the poet Henry Wadsworth Longfellow. After his graduation from Bowdoin College in 1825, Hawthorne came back to Salem and turned to writing for 12 years. During this period of time, he read widely and became further acquainted with the local history. Hawthorne anonymously published his first novel titled *Fanshawe* in 1828 and several short stories in various periodicals, which he collected in 1837 as *Twice* – *Told Tales*. Hawthorne was offered an appointment as weigher and gauger at the Boston Custom House at a salary of \$1,500 a year in 1839.

Later, Hawthorne was greatly influenced by the Transcendentalism, and joined the Brook Farm with an investment for \$1,500 in 1841, which was a Utopian community founded by some high-minded intellectuals. His original plan was to find an ideal home for his fiancée, Sophia Peabody, and himself. However, Hawthorne left the community at the end of that year with disappointment. Though his stay there proved no more successful, the experience influenced him a lot and offered the source for his novel *The Blithedale Romance* later, which is the only work written in the first person,



describing the contemporary life. In 1842, Hawthorne married Sophia Peabody and moved to The Manse in Concord, the center of the transcendental movement for 3 years. He acquainted himself with some famous writers there, such as Emerson and Thoreau, and took a series of relevant activities about transcendentalism.

由于霍桑出众的文学天赋,1821 年他在亲戚资助下进入波多因学院,同学中包括许多重要的文学家和政治家,其中有后来当选为总统的富兰克林·皮尔斯与诗人朗费罗等。1825 年霍桑大学毕业后,回到塞勒姆镇,从事写作长达 12 年之久。在这段时间,霍桑广泛阅读各种书籍,对当地的历史也有了更深地了解。1828 年,霍桑匿名发表了第一部长篇小说《范肖》,随后在一些期刊上陆续出版短篇小说,并于 1837 年收入《重讲一遍的故事》一书中。霍桑曾于 1839 年任职波士顿海关计量员,年薪 1500 美元。

由于受到超验主义的影响,霍桑在 1841 年参加了超验主义者创办的乌托邦式公社——布鲁克农场,并投资了 1500 美元,目的是为他和他的未婚妻索菲娅•阿•皮博迪在此寻找一个家,但年底便失望地退出了该社。尽管霍桑的理想在此并未得到实现,但这一经历却对他有着重要的影响,为他后来的著作《福谷传奇》提供了素材,这也是霍桑唯一一部以第一人称描写当代生活的作品。霍桑于 1842 年与索菲娅结婚,并在其后的 3 年与妻子迁居超验主义哲学的基地——康考德镇,在那里他结识了作家爱默生、梭罗等人,并参加了一系列的相关活动。

Hawthorne returned to Salem, where he was appointed surveyor of the Salem Customs House in 1846. However, as a faithful Democrat, Hawthorne was dismissed from this post in June 1849 when the Whig Party returned to power. After that, Hawthorne devoted himself to his most famous novel, The Scarlet Letter (1850). In 1851, Hawthorne published another novel The House of the Seven Gables, which is describing how the misdeeds of the ancestors bring misfortunes to the offspring. The poet and critic James Russell Lowell said it was better than The Scarlet Letter and called it "the most valuable cont-ribution to New England history that has been made". With Pierce's election as President, Hawthorne was rewarded with the position of the United States consul in Liverpool in 1853. In 1857, his appointment ended, and the Hawthorne family toured France and then stayed in Italy, where Hawthorne began to write his The Marble Faun, a novel which focused on the good and the evil. Hawthorne and his family returned to Concord in

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1860, and he published *The Marble Faun* that year. He died in his sleep on May 19, 1864, in Plymouth, New Hampshire in the U.S. while on a tour with Pierce, leaving 4 unfinished works.

1846年霍桑回到萨勒姆,担任萨勒姆海关检察官。1849年6月,辉格党(现共和党前身)当权后,霍桑作为一名忠诚的民主党人士,便被新政府解除海关职务。此后,霍桑便致力于创作活动,写出了他最著名的长篇小说《红字》(1850)。第二年,霍桑又出版了另外一部著名的作品《带有七个尖角阁的房子》,这是一部描写祖先谋财害命,其罪孽殃及子孙的长篇小说。诗人兼评论家的洛厄尔·詹姆斯·罗素称这部作品比《红字》更为出色,是"对新英格兰历史所做的最有价值的贡献"。皮尔斯当选为美国总统后,霍桑于1853年被任命为驻英国利物浦的领事。1857年任期结束后,霍桑连同家人去法国旅游,后侨居在意大利,并在那里开始创作讨论善恶问题的长篇小说《玉石雕像》。1860年霍桑及其家人返回康科德并出版了《玉石雕像》。1864年5月19日,霍桑在与皮尔斯结伴旅游途中,在美国新罕布什尔州普利茅斯去世。去世时,仍然留下4部未完成的著作。

## \*\* Writing Style 写作风格 \*\*

Hawthorne developed a new form of fiction—the romance in American literature. He claimed several times that the romance is radically different from the novel. In the prefaces of *The Scarlet Letter* and *The House of the Seven Gables*, Hawthorne defined what romance meant to him. According to Hawthorne's interpretation, romance is different from the realistic novels. The traditional realistic novels stress representations of the external world or human experiences with verisimilitude, but the romance is more concerned with "truths of the human heart", which allows the author to deviate from reality in favor of imagination freely.

霍桑是美国文学史上浪漫主义小说的开创者,他曾多次声明他写的不是小说,而是罗曼史。霍桑在其作品《红字》以及《七个尖角阁的房子》的前言中都曾提到过罗曼史的概念。在他看来,浪漫主义小说与现实主义小说是不同的,传统的现实主义小说侧重对客观世界以及人们生活经验的真实反映,而罗曼小说却更多地关注人们"心灵的真实",也就为作者提供了自由发挥想象力的空间。

The themes in Hawthorne's works often center on the problems like sin, crime and punishment, and the most distinguished feature in his works lies in the revealing of the internal darkness of human beings, which shows the influence of "original sin" he learned from Christianity. According to the belief of Christianity, "original sin" will pass on from generation to generation since Adam and Eve ate the forbidden fruit against the willing of God and were expelled from the Garden of Eden, and it refers to the sin that everyone is born with. In the eyes of the Puritans, God is almighty and righteous and man is sinful and evil. With the influence of such a kind of religion, Hawthorne believes that man is evil-natured and sinful. In his opinion, all the social problems, the conflicts between human beings and the crimes result from the "inherent evil" of human beings rather than the material life, and the "inherent evil" is the root of all misfortunes. Without doubt, Hawthorne is greatly influenced by the Calvinism of original sin, which is known as Hawthorne's "black vision".

At the same time, Hawthorne was influenced by the transcendentalism, which emphasizes the significance and dignity of the individual, and believes that the individual is the most important element in society. Because of the constant influence by the idea of inherent evil of Puritanism as well as the optimistic attitude of transcendentalism, Hawthorne shows his ambivalent attitude to human beings in his works, and the characters are always the mixture of evil and good, which makes the thoughts of the characters profound.

霍桑作品中的主题一般都集中于探讨罪恶、犯罪和惩罚等问题,揭示人类心灵深处的黑暗面成了他最重要的创作特征。这在很大程度上反映出基督教中"原罪"带给他的影响。基督教认为,自从亚当、夏娃在伊甸园违背上帝教导偷食禁果被逐出乐园之后,"原罪"代代相传,人类注定要背负与生俱来的罪孽。清教徒更是极力宣扬上帝是全能的、完美的,人类是罪恶的、卑劣的。在这一宗教思想的影响下,霍桑总是倾向于"人性恶"的论断。他认为,一切社会问题、人与人之间的矛盾、犯罪现象等的根源都不在社会物质生活中,而是世界上固有的一种"恶"造成的,"恶"是人的本性的自然组成部分,是一切不幸的根源。毫无疑问,霍桑深受加尔文教派关于与生俱来的堕落与原罪思想的影响,评论家称之为霍桑的"黑暗视角"。


与此同时,他受到超验主义思想的影响,即强调个人具有无上的意义和尊严,认为个人是社会最重要的元素。正是由于清教的人性本恶和超验哲学的人性本善的观念不停地影响着霍桑,他对人性的认识具有模棱两可的特性,因而其作品中的人物也成为善与恶的混合体,加深了作品人物的思想纬度。

Because of the Puritan tradition of his family and his unique life experience, Hawthorne shows an obvious intention for teaching in his works; however, he can't express his ideas freely to avoid the offense from the contemporary society and government. Therefore, he is adept at using elaborate symbolism to express his views. Taking *The Scarlet Letter* as an example, the meaning of the letter A undergoes an imperceptible change as Hester's moral development, and it has numerous interpretations. At first, it is a symbol of the shame "adultery", but then Hester changes it into "able" with her delicate embroideries for the townspeople, and finally, it signifies "angel" because of her generosity and kindness.

Furthermore, the names of the characters in the novel also have symbolic meanings. For example, Arthur Dimmesdale, a well-regarded young minister, whose initials are AD, standing for "adultery", which means that Arthur Dimmesdale is altually an aduter. Meanwhile, "Dim" means "dark and weak", and "dale" means "valley", so the name of the minister is actually a symbol of the "dim-interior". Another example is the name of Roger Chillingworth, in which "Chilling" comes from the word "chilly", meaning this man is a merciless avenger. There are lots of other examples with symbolic meanings in the novel, such as the scaffold, the wild rose-bush in front of the prison door as well as the forest, to mention just a few.

由于霍桑的清教家庭背景以及他独特的生活经历,其作品中的说教意图非常明显;然而,为了避免冒犯社会和政教当局,他又不可能直抒心意。因此,他经常借助巧妙的象征手段来抒发自己的感想。以《红字》为例,小说中的字母 "A"便是霍桑这种艺术特点的杰出运用。随着女主人公海丝特品行的发展,人们对它的内涵做出了多种解释。它最初的意义为"通奸" (adultery),后来海丝特凭借自己的双手为镇上的人们刺绣出精美的女红,镇上的人也都视她为一个"能干" (able) 的人。而她的乐善好施,不求回报,又令人们觉得她如"天使" (angle)。

同时,小说中主人公的名字也是别具匠心。例如,受人尊敬的年轻牧师亚瑟•丁梅斯代尔(Arthur Dimmesdale)的两个首字母 AD 正好是"Adultery"(通奸)的前两个首字母,这实际上在暗示 Arthur Dimmesdale 是一个通奸者;同时,"Dim"的意思是"阴暗的,虚弱的","Dale"的意思是"山谷",所以牧师的名字实际上是他"阴暗内心"的象征。又如,罗杰•齐灵渥斯(Roger Chillingworth),"chilling"源于"chilly"(寒意,冰冷,缺乏怜悯等),这也暗示了他是一个无情的复仇者。除此之外,小说中还有大量富有象征意义的事物,如刑台,监狱门前的野



蔷薇以及森林等。由于篇幅所限,这里就不一一详述。

Hawthorne is adept at revealing the inner conflicts and psychological movements of the characters, because the most important thing Hawthorne concerns himself about is the heart of human beings. In his opinion, the origin of evil is the human heart, therefore, the best way to reveal evil is from "truths of the human heart"; furthermore, the human behaviors resulted from the psychological movement, the description about the characters must be superficial without the exposure of the inner world. There are several chapters in *The Scarlet Letter* functioning as the characters' "interior monologue" (Chapters 5, 9 and 11), which reveal the complicated inner world of the characters. Therefore, Hawthorne's works are always called "psychological romance".

Last but not least, the supernatural element always plays an important role in Hawthorne's works, for which his works are enveloped in a mysterious religious atmosphere all the time. And furthermore, he keeps an obvious and strong teaching intention in his works, and his language is always full of obscurity and gloom.

霍桑作品的另一大特点是非常注重揭示人物的内心冲突和心理活动。一方面,霍桑最关心的是人的心灵。在他看来,人心是万恶之源,因而揭露人的"恶"的最佳方法便是从反映"心灵的真实"着手;另一方面,人的行为举止终有其心理依据,如不进行心理挖掘,人物只能停留在表象上,必然显得肤浅。《红字》中有许多章节描述了人物的"内心独白",真实地勾勒出了人物复杂的内心世界(如第5章、第9章以及第11章)。因此,霍桑的作品也被称为"心灵罗曼史"。

最后,需要提到的一点是,霍桑的作品中经常描述到超自然因素,带有神秘的宗教气氛;他的作品说教意味浓厚,文字较为晦涩,基调阴郁。

## Comment on the Author 评论与影响。

Hawthorne is one of the best writers of American Romanticism in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. Although Hawthorne once said his works couldn't bring broad influences, he created a lot of remarkable works and established his own writing style. Herman Melville, his contemporary writer and the author of *Moby Dick*, even regarded him as an equal of Shakespeare in his critical article *Hawthorne and His Mosses* in 1850. Furthermore, Hawthorne helped to change the original

scheme of *Moby Dick*. Henry James, the famous American writer, also spoke highly of Hawthorne and said "Hawthorne's work will remain ... Among the men of imagination he will always have his niche." D. H. Lawrence called him "a blue-eyed darling"; although he "knew disagreeable things in his inner soul", he "was careful to send them out in disguise." Poe, his contemporary writer, in his review of *Twice-told Tales* in 1842, said Hawthorne's tales "belong to the highest region of art—an art subservient to genius of a very lofty order". Ernest Hemingway and William Faulkner also gave high credit for Hawthorne and acknowledged that they learned much from him.


霍桑被视为 19 世纪美国浪漫主义文学潮流中最出色的作家之一。霍桑曾非常谦虚地宣称他的作品不会引起广泛的观注,但事实却正好相反。霍桑创作了不少不朽的著作,并且创立了自己独具特色的写作风格。与他同时代的麦尔维尔(小说《白鲸》的作者)深受其影响,在他 1850 年的评论文章《霍桑和他的青苔》中甚至称霍桑与英国的莎士比亚不分伯仲;霍桑还改变了《白鲸》创作的初衷;著名小说家亨利·詹姆斯也高度赞扬霍桑说:"他的作品将永驻……他将在富于想象者的圣殿中永保其牌位。" D.H.劳伦斯称他为 "蓝眼睛的宝贝",深信"灵魂中所隐藏的讨厌的东西",而又能"小心地把它们伪装好送出来"。而爱伦·坡也在他为《重讲一遍的故事》所写的评论中盛赞霍桑的小说"属于艺术的最高境界"。作家海明威和福克纳也对霍桑给予了高度的评价,并承认霍桑对他们产生了深远的影响。
