Preface

This is a study of the European Court of Human Rights' doctrinal response to complaints for protection under the Convention for the Protection of Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms (the European Human Rights Convention) (Rome, 4 November 1950; TS 71 (1953); cmd 8969) submitted by or on behalf of companies. Companies indisputably enjoy Convention protection in principle yet the protection of persons closely tied with for-profit and corporate business enterprise is sometimes doctrinally problematic. The book analyses the Court's reasoning in three groups of cases in which corporate human rights litigation has presented particular problems of treaty interpretation. The case law is streamlined in a minimalist fashion, which often obscures the Court's rationale. The book construes the structural framework within which the Court operates, and seeks to explain how the relevant case law is largely coherent when considered on these grounds. The Court's response is used for highlighting crucial aspects of the Convention system that are aptly revealed but which extend beyond the company context. These are the Convention as a European liberal project, a characteristic that makes it stand out from the bulk of international human rights law; the complex nature of the Convention's object and purpose, and, consequently, the Court's teleology; and finally, the collective and economic aspects of the Convention's civil and political rights. Ultimately I have wanted to show that human rights law can be a many-sided thing.

The book is based on my thesis submitted to the Faculty of Law at the University of Oxford for the degree of D.Phil. It is the result of three and a half years of work in Oxford, in New York, and in Oslo. A number of people and institutions deserves acknowledgement. In particular I wish to thank my supervisor, Professor Christopher McCrudden of Lincoln College. I have benefited from his brilliance and been encouraged by his geniality.

Thanks also to my first year assessors, Professor Paul Craig of St John's College and Professor Vaughan Lowe of All Souls College; to my examiners, Professor Colin Warbrick of Durham University and Dr Mads Andenæs, then Director of the British Institute of International and Comparative Law; and to Professor Peter Muchlinski of the University of Kent, the Press's reviewer. I am indebted to Sir Nicolas Bratza and Professors Lucius Caflisch and Matti Pellonpää, judges of the European Court of Human Rights, who found time to read parts of my thesis and discuss some problems with me

in Strasbourg in between their work at an overburdened Court. I also thank Associate Professor Jan E. Helgesen of the Norwegian Centre for Human Rights, University of Oslo; Professor Ola Mestad of the Centre for European Law at the University of Oslo; Professor Jørgen Aall of the University of Bergen; and Professor Francesca Klug of the Centre for the Study of Human Rights, London School of Economics. Professor Joseph H. H. Weiler of the New York University School of Law I thank for his general advice that good research is characterized less by finding answers and more by discovering new problems that need further studies. Dr Gwen Booth deserves a particular thank-you for her kind and properly demanding editorship at the Press.

Thanks to the staff of the Bodleian Law Library; the Lincoln College Library; the library of the Centre for Socio-Legal Studies in Oxford; the New York University School of Law Library; and the library of the Norwegian Centre for Human Rights; to Mr Chris Saunders for his proof-reading and improvement of a rather un-English manuscript; to Mr Fredrik Anspach for his diligent check of sources; and to Associate Professor Solveig Schult Ulriksen at the Institute of Classical and Roman Studies at the University of Oslo in finding the original version of a proverb of Voltaire, which has been rendered in countless ways in various sources.

Le secret d'ennuyer est celui de tout dire can roughly be translated thus: the best way to bore people is to tell them everything. It epitomizes my thesis approach in the sense that it has not been my intention to reveal all aspects of the status of companies' rights under the European Convention on Human Rights, but rather to focus on some problematic fields for the purpose of generating insight of the Convention as a whole.
